

Intellectual Property

- A. All unit members while either working actively, on leave, vacation or any other pauses in consistent employment by University, will have sole ownership of Intellectual Property (IP) rights to all ideas, products, lectures, syllabi, quizzes, slide decks, materials, novels, articles, screenplays, teleplays, theatrical plays, films, digital content, musicals, creative dance choreography; published and not published, written, named, and not named works that may be considered created by the unit members.
- B. Notes and lecture materials (written and electronic) are the intellectual property of the unit members and may not be used without written permission and compensation of licensing of the IP materials when used by the other unit members or by the University. Likewise, course lectures may not be filmed or otherwise recorded without written permission of the unit members. If University publishes, screens, or posts filmed lectures or presentations by unit member then University must compensate unit member a license fee per post or published entity of no less than \$500 per post. All posted film lectures or presentations must be with written consent by unit members no later than 15 days prior to posting or publishing. Payment must be issued within two weeks to unit members.
- C. The University acknowledges the right and sole ownership of IP of unit members to prepare and publish, through individual initiative, articles, pamphlets, books, and other materials and all creative works as mentioned above; and the right of the unit members to benefit individually from any income that may be generated from such works; even when the unit member prepares such work while actively employed by the University. None of those incomes are or will be issued to the University but to the unit members only.
- D. Any form that can be trademarked, patented, or copyrighted and is created by the unit members is solely owned by the unit members, inclusive of items formally or not formally copyrighted, trademarked, or patented.
- E. The University shall inform all students of the protected status of materials and works described in this Article.
- F. Nothing in this Article shall prohibit unit members from voluntarily sharing materials with other unit members.
