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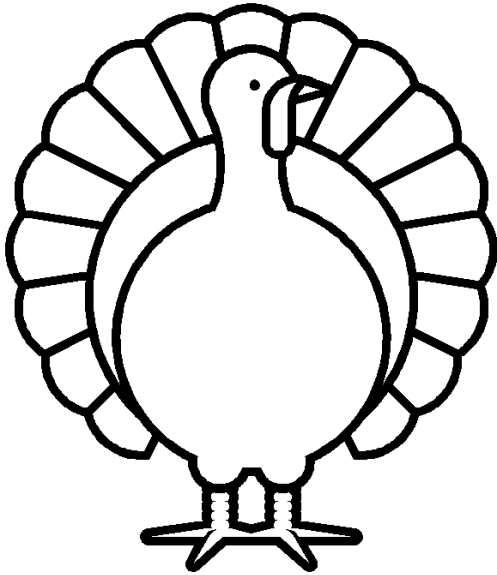
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Ideas: Many teachers-pay-teachers book reports for younger kids. I wrote mine using some of these ideas to fit my fourth and fifth grade class that needed work on writing complete paragraphs.

Examples: From students in my class

Turkey Book Report



Students must pick a fictional chapter book that is at their level to read for the month of November. Let the teacher know what book you have chosen by _____ so that it can be approved. By _____, you need to have finished reading your book and completed this book report on it. This can be done earlier if you finish earlier.

For your November book report, you will be making a turkey to show off your knowledge of the book. An example was shown in class. Please do it neatly. It is recommended to rough draft your sentences and edit them before writing them on the feathers. I will be checking for complete sentences, indented paragraphs, and spelling on words you should know. Here is what your book report needs to include:

- Body - Write your name, the title of the book, and the author. Make sure that I can read your writing. It needs to either be written on white paper and then glued onto brown paper or be written on white paper and colored, going around the words, brown.
- Feather 1 - Draw and color the setting of the story. Use your best drawing skills and include details. Label anything that is not self-explanatory.
- Feather 2 - Write a 3-5 sentence paragraph that tell the main problem of the story and how it's solved.
- Feather 3 - Write a 3-5 sentence paragraph explaining the main character and what they are like. Describe what they look like, what some character traits that they have are, and any other details you find about them.
- Feather 4 - Write a 3-5 sentence paragraph about your favorite part of the story.
- Feather 5 - List the other important characters in the story and tell one important thing about them.
- Give your turkey a head and feet.
