Week of the "Francophonie" (2nd week of November) - Project of the French team in MHS

Each French class was part of a project related to the French-speaking world; their projects are exhibited in the library of MHS. The students did a great job!

French 4 Immersion

Students analyzed the various cultural products, practices and perspectives of Francophone Communities. They created colorful posters and miniature objects for a "francophone Museum".

French 5 Immersion

Students researched traditional, contemporary, or famous architect houses in francophone countries around the world. With a partner, they created 2D or 3D representations of the houses, described the material used and the features related to the culture, climate, and geography of the country they chose.

French 6 Immersion

Students researched famous francophone entrepreneurs and their impact on the society of their respective countries.

French 7 Immersion

Students presented French-speaking cities around the world (except from France): they had to choose interesting facts that described the best of the city, explained why the city is part of the francophone world, drew a map of the city with the strategic areas, built an artifact that is a symbol of the city and justified their choices.

AP French

They are doing a project about a French speaking country: it is a long year project; so we can't show them in the library now.

French 1 Non-Immersion

Students have been studying sports and the Olympic Games 2024 and showcased some important francophone athletes

French 2 Non-Immersion

Students have been examining the global nature of *La Francophonie* and its many cultures. They created presentations on famous Francophone people and their cultural products, practices and perspectives.

French 3 Non-Immersion

Students have been working on an in-depth exploration of the city of Paris. Students completed a free-choice project on this theme, producing such work as travel brochures, poems, paintings and guided tour videos.

French 4 and 5 non immersion

In light of our unit on routines and the environment, students created models of natural features from six Francophone countries, one from each continent. This project highlighted the importance of protecting our natural habitats and inspired us to consider eco-friendly lifestyle changes.
