TOPIC: The Question of Iran and the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA)

*Keeping in mind* the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) as the result of onerous negotiation attempts,

*Fully aware* of the constant and threatening tensions caused from the aftermath of the JCPOA,

*Deeply concerned* by the Islamic Republic of Iran's attempts on pushing the boundaries of the accord,

*Emphasizing* the importance of political and diplomatic endeavors to secure current treaties with solutions that would benefit global nuclear non-proliferation,

*Bearing in mind* the United States of America's withdrawal from the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action chosen by the Trump administration as a blatant act of caprice,

*Aware* of the compliance of the JCPOA withdrawn from the Islamic Republic of Iran,

*Noting with deep concern* the heightened allegations of nuclear facilities concealed by the Islamic Republic of Iran,

1. Calls upon the nations to cooperate and establish peace in the controversy with specific actions being:
  - a. Endorsing the signatory of the Modern Nuclear Program Treaty (MNPT) between the Islamic Republic of Iran and the P5+1 nations alongside the Republic of India with specific actions being, but not limited to:
    - i. Halting the uranium production in the Islamic Republic of Iran,
    - ii. Preventing an illegitimate nuclear program which may concern and jeopardize the stability of other nations in the region,
    - iii. Appeasing the apprehensions from the global community,
  - b. Initiating monthly talks and regular meetings between the P5+1 nations and the Islamic Republic of Iran to further bolster cooperation and prevent any potential disputes as observed from previous consequences,
    - i. Prominent and diverse world leaders or representatives, preferably all P5+1 nation leaders, who will suggest possible solutions to those problems by setting up goals to achieve by a set date, they must meet up every month to check the progress of the problem trying to get solved,
  - c. Endorsing any country that has been voted for as a mediator force to quell controversies and the +1 nation in the treaty, with confined and impartial power, with responsibilities such as:

- i. Initiating talks between the nations to avoid any potential misconception,
  - ii. Funding for the talks and any military inspections from the P5+1 nations and the Republic of India,
  - iii. Preserving a long-lasting deal that promotes peace and appeases the conflict,
- d. Requesting the Islamic Republic of Iran to cooperate with the international community with the objective of establishing a nuclear program consensus by:
  - i. Allowing the scrutiny of international inspectors from the P5+1 nations in Iran's military sites,
  - ii. Participate in the initiated talks to avoid disputes and misconceptions,
- e. Demanding involving nations to firmly abide with the new agreement and refrain from:
  - i. Arbitrarily withdrawing from the MNPT,
  - ii. Recklessly imposing sanctions on the Islamic Republic of Iran for any ambiguous reasons,
  - iii. Irresponsibly assassinating the top leader or military officials from a foreign nation,
  - iv. Coercing a foreign nation's concession by targeting cultural sites which blatantly violates the International Law,
- f. Encouraging trade opportunities and economic cooperations between sides to bolster the peace endeavors for both sides, such as:
  - i. Direct flights between major cities of both sides,

- ii. Cooperation between major corporations of both countries in order to prosper and create opportunities,
- g. Endorsing punishments for any flagrant violations on the Modern Nuclear Program Treaty (MNPT) such as, but not limited to:
  - i. Imposing sanctions and tariffs on any violating nations,
  - ii. Removal from the MNPT and further condemnations in order to keep nations accountable with the objective of establishing peace,
- h. Asks for other countries not involved in conflict with either the US or Iran to:
  - i. Join India as mediator forces.
