ORDERS OF THE SENTRIES

1. Take charge of this post and all government property in view.
- 2. Walk my post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert, and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.**
3. Report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.
- 4. Repeat all calls from any post more distant from the guard house (quarterdeck) than my own.**
5. Quit my post only when properly relieved.
- 6. Receive, obey, and pass on to the sentry who relieves me all orders from the commanding officer, command duty officer, officer of the deck, and officers and petty officers of the watch only.**
7. Talk to no one except in the line of duty.
- 8. Give the alarm in case of fire or disorder.**
9. Call the Officer of the Deck in any case not covered by instructions.
- 10. Salute all officers and all colors and standards not cased.**
11. Be especially watchful at night, and during the time for challenging, challenge all persons on or near my post, and allow no one to pass without proper authority.

UNIFORM MEASUREMENTS & REGULATIONS

FEMALE:

Hair: Clean, neatly shaped, and presents a well-groomed appearance. Lopsided or asymmetrical haircuts and hairstyles are not authorized. The wearing of an approved style is authorized provided it does not prohibit the proper wear of safety gear and allows uniform headgear to be worn squarely on the head. Maximum 2 inches in bulk, bun cannot exceed past sides of head, hair cannot pass the collar more than 3 inches.

Nails: Cannot exceed more than $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch past tip of finger

Earrings: One per ear, silver or gold ball

Name tag: 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ down bisecting the shoulder seam of the RIGHT side

Ribbons: 6 ¼ down bisecting the shoulder seam of the LEFT side

MALE:

Hair: Clean, neatly shaped, and presents a well-groomed appearance. Maximum 2 inches in bulk and 4 inches in length,

Nails: Cannot exceed past tip of finger

Name tag: ¼ centered above breast pocket of the RIGHT side

Ribbons: ¼ centered above breast pocket of the LEFT side

BOTH:

What is the measurement of the JBAR? 1 ⅞ inches up bisecting the LEFT collar point

Rank: 1 ⅞ inches up bisecting the RIGHT collar point

Cover: Centered 2 inches in from the fold and 1 ½ inches up

Service Stars: ¼ inch centered above ribbons

Wrist Watch/Bracelet: One of each is authorized. No anklets

Rings: One per hand is authorized, plus the engagement ring or the wedding rings

RECOGNIZING RANKS

BASIC DRILL KNOWLEDGE

Attention: Heels touching, toes pointed out, feet at a 45 degree angle

Arms while marching: 6 inches to the front 3 inches to the rear

Step size: 30 inch steps

Quicktime: 112-120 bpm

Doubletime: 180 bpm

Eyes right/left: Head turns 45 degrees to the direction said. EYES RIGHT: third squad doesn't turn heads. EYES LEFT: First squad doesn't turn their head.

- How many are red: 7
- How many are white: 6

How many stars: 50 - represent the 50 states

What is the arrangement of the stars: Five rows of 6, 4 rows of 5, alternating

Blue: Vigilance, Perseverance and Justice

Red: Hardiness & Valor

White: Purity & Innocence

3 types of flags: Storm, Post, Garrison

Garrison dimensions: 20ft x 36ft

Post dimensions: 10ftx20

Storm dimensions: 5ftx9ft

Shape the flag is folded into: Cocked hat

Who made the 1st American flag: Besty Ross (13 stars)

When can the flag be flown for 24 hours: When the base is illuminated

What do you do if you have a hat on for pledges: Men take off hat, women don't have to

Who wrote the Star-Spangled Banner: Francis Scott Key

When is the flag flown at half-mast: Death of a prominent citizen(s)

When is the flag flown upside down: **Event of emergency or distress**

Which flags dip: **All flags except for the American flags, except while being overseas**

What do you do if the Star-Spangled Banner is playing while you're driving: **Pull over and stand outside vehicle**

What do you do if Star-Spangled Banner is playing but you can't see the flags: **Face the music**

How many versions of the American flag have there been: **27**

What position is the american flag in when displayed: **Position of honor**

What is the position of honor: **In front of, highest point, or right side**
