### **International Mindedness**

During their last unit, our kindergarten students inquired into art, music, and dance from all different countries. First graders looked at food as a natural resource and considered foods from around the world. Our 2nd grade students explored money from around the world in our learning lab, and different perspectives and values when it comes to roles in a global economy. 3rd and 4th graders both looked at resources that early Native Americans used and have taken that learning to explore resource availability and the cultural impact it had in different countries. In their ongoing unit, "How we express ourselves," 5th grade students have learned about different forms of artistic expression and have had the opportunity to look at forms of architecture that were designed by Frank Llloyd Wright, who is not only closely connected to Arizona, but also has designs around the world! They also learned a lot about Dia De Los Muertos! On Wednesday, December 21 from 3:30-5:30, we'd like to invite our families in to explore Winter Holidays Around the World as a special celebration of cultures before break.

### **Balance**

One of our Learner Profile Traits is to be balanced. As a way of showing how important this is for all of us, we have dedicated one day a month to "Family Fun Night." On this day each month, teachers will not assign homework and we just want you to spend special time together as a family. Social emotional well-being is critical to the health of all of us, but especially our children.



Pre-K students demonstrate the <u>Learner</u>
<u>Profile Traits</u>, <u>caring and reflective</u>, by talking through difficult moments with the "Sorry Sloth."



Kindergarten students <u>inquire</u> into <u>how we</u> <u>express ourselves</u> by looking at art <u>forms</u> around the <u>world</u> and trying out Mandarin symbols. This is also a form of <u>communication!</u>



First grade students <u>inquire</u> into animal habitats by making and measuring out a life-sized eagle's nest. They definitely had to use their <u>social and communication skills</u> to complete this task!



## A Look Around Campus

Second grade students are given the <u>agency</u> to design products and make business plans, sell their products, use pretend currency to shop at their peers' stores, and take <u>action</u> by thinking about how they could donate some of their profits.



Third graders start to have <u>experiences</u> and <u>ask questions</u> about early Native American culture by observing artifacts and making paint out of berries in the learning lab.



Fourth graders share their knowledge of Native American cultures and the resources they used by building models of dwellings and writing informative essays about different tribes.
