

2nd Artificial Intelligence in Medical Education Conference 2025 (AIMEC)

GUIDELINES FOR FREE ORAL PRESENTATION

General

Presenters will be given 10 minutes for their oral presentation, followed by a 5-minute Q&A session. Presentations should be clear, concise, and well-structured, covering key sections such as the background, objective, methodology, results, discussion, and conclusion. A total of 8 to 10 slides is recommended. Use bullet points and visuals to enhance clarity and avoid overcrowding slides with text. Rehearse beforehand to ensure you stay within the time limit. During the Q&A session, listen carefully to questions, respond clearly, and be open to discussion. Please engage your audience and present your work with confidence.

Abstract Submission

The abstract must be self-contained, written in clear academic English, and aligned with the theme as follow:

1. **Digital Transformation in Medical Education Teaching, Learning and Assessment**
2. **Navigating the Future of Medical Education: Innovation, Integration, and Impact**

All abstracts must be structured using the following components:

- **Introduction** – Provide brief background information and context for the study or concept, highlighting the issue being addressed.
- **Objective** – Clearly state the aim or purpose of the research or concept proposal.
- **Methodology** – Summarize the study design, procedures, or proposed approach. For concept papers, outline the framework or strategy to be used.
- **Results and Discussion** – For completed studies, present key findings with relevant data and interpret the results in context. For concept-based submissions, discuss the anticipated outcomes and their potential implications.
- **Conclusion** – Highlight the main takeaway, potential impact, and directions for future work or application.

The abstract should not exceed **300 words**, excluding the title and author information. Do not include references, tables, or figures. Use standard scientific language and avoid excessive jargon.

GUIDELINES FOR e-POSTER PRESENTATION

General

All presenters are required to follow the e-poster presentation format set by the scientific committee. Each e-poster presentation will consist of a **three (3)-minute** oral introduction by the presenter, followed by a **two (2)-minute** session for questions and discussion from the audience. In addition to the live presentations, all e-posters will also be available in the e-poster showcase, allowing conference participants to view them at any time during the event.

e-Poster Layout and Size

- **Poster Size:** A0 (841 mm width × 1189 mm height)
- **Orientation:** Portrait (Vertical)
- **Aspect Ratio:** 9:16
- Please ensure your poster is designed according to this size to avoid distortion or cropping during the display.

e-Poster File Format & Resolution

- **Accepted Format:** PDF (single-page only)
- **Minimum Resolution:** 150 dpi (dots per inch) for clear viewing
- **Maximum File Size:** 10 MB
- All fonts must be embedded, and images/graphics should be of high quality to maintain readability.

Abstract Submission
