

♥Ridgewood Commons (RC) Explainer♥

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Introduction and purpose

We find ourselves amid a long emergency of social crises and climate collapse, as a destabilized state aims to further divide us. We recognize that no one is coming to save us, and that our collective survival will depend on taking our destiny into our own hands.

In founding Ridgewood Commons (RC), we are building a hub that will help us transcend mere survival and cultivate care, autonomy, and connectedness in Ridgewood, Queens. We are building on the legacy and intention of past movement spaces in the area while adapting to the changing composition of the community.

This document explains how we govern ourselves – our principles, structures, and processes. Like the RC itself, it is a living document that can change and evolve.

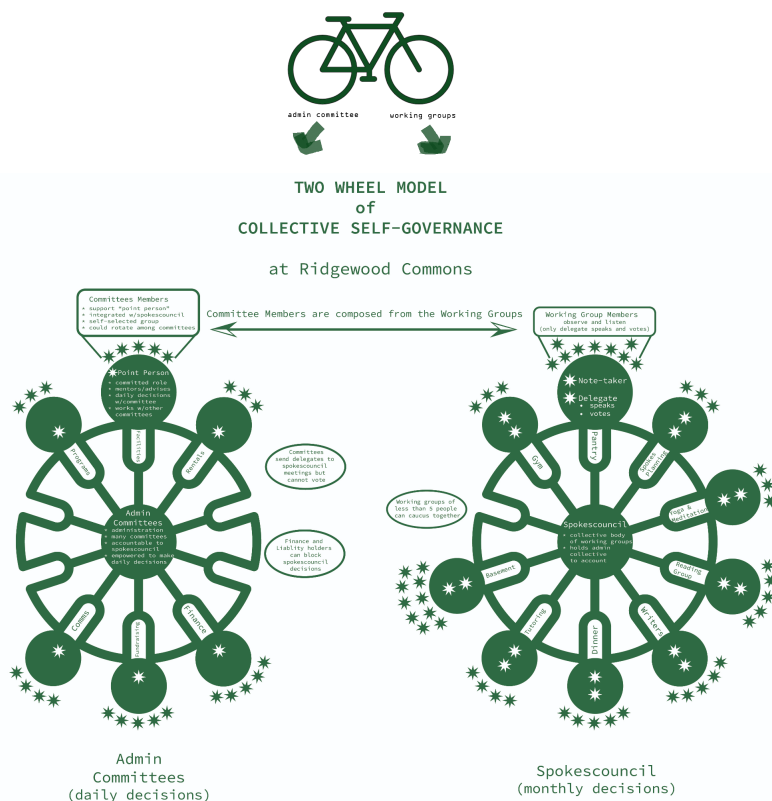


Principles for working together

Our *Points of (Ridgewood Comm)Unity* guide us:

- Commitment to anti-authoritarian, anti-capitalist, anti-fascist politics – authority and resources are collectively held
- Commitment to autonomy and decentralisation – working groups self-govern; everyone can shape RC.
- Commitment to mutual aid and collective resource sharing – programming goals of collective care, redistribution, and solidarity.
- Commitment to “Invitationality” – ensuring the space and culture is open and welcoming to a broad range of participants without sacrificing collective safety or political efficacy. Commitment to developing internal accountability practices that balance care and responsibility.
- Commitment to accountability with care – Responsibility + support, not punishment.
- Commitment to learning from History – Acknowledging past exclusions, committing to do better.

RC governance structure: The two-wheel model



Front Wheel = Working Groups (WG) -

- Autonomous projects (e.g., Gym, Pantry, Sunday dinner) that self-form as long as 5¹ people are involved and a charter is ratified by the Spokescouncil.
- WGs steer RC, setting direction and holding accountability
- WGs are coordinated through the Spokescouncil (which is all of us!).
- WGs can submit proposals for review at Spokescouncil meetings and are expected to send a delegate to vote on proposals and a note-taker to help in shareback from each spokescouncil meeting

Back Wheel = Admin Committees (AC)

- Handle daily operations and management of the physical space
- The admin committees are coordinated through the Admin Collective
- Each committee has a point person accountable to reporting updates to Spokescouncil at meetings
- The AC is not a decision-making body beyond the scope of their charters; Therefore, AC point people do not vote on proposals brought to the spokescouncil

In addition to the two wheels (admin collective and working groups) lease holders handle and speak for liability and legal issues. These individuals have veto power on the basis of liability/ legality that is separate from collective decision-making. **The scope of lease holder power is defined in XXXX.**

Food pantry	The RC Food Pantry is a mutual aid food pantry at Ridgewood Commons, providing free groceries to neighbors in Ridgewood twice a week. Volunteers pick up, sort, and distribute donated food, manage storage and food safety, and help make sure distributions are fair, accessible, and consistent—especially for elders and people with disabilities.
