Learning How to Keep Track of Your Sources Using Technology

Purpose: One of the biggest problems that new graduate writers have with their sources is the overwhelming number that they need can easily get confused or lost. Although there are still plenty of great manuscripts written using library textbooks and physical sources, most research papers nowadays use digital references—research articles, digital books, and videos. Fortunately, there are now more resources than ever that help researching writers keep track of their references easily. All TAMIU Students have free access to RefWorks, a browser-based program designed to help you keep track of your sources.
