

National Security Strategy: India

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Introduction

A National Security Strategy encompasses the primary objectives of a nation during periods of attacks, insurgency, or conflict. The document would display with transparency the motives, stands, and priorities of the state when in crisis. The larger goals of connections and national security in the global framework are also explored. Various means of threats and the method of neutralization are discussed based on the policies that the state has already established.

The discussed threats along with their ideal resolution are discussed from the perspective of the ideal route of action and diplomatic long-term interests. War - Support and Diplomatic positioning

In the event of war or international conflict, India's measure of India's power and position in the conflict needs to be identified. The absence of direct involvement brings the need to choose a position of support diplomatically. This choice can be made based on the larger network of diplomatic connections and standing that the country has with the parties involved or the larger framework of power and alliance. Counter-terrorism measures and civilian safety

Noting the need to stay relevant and powerful enough in the larger framework will always ensure the role of India in the larger global panel. The rising importance in the smaller country collectives will be taken as a long-term objective that will increase the global scale significance of the nation.

Methods of resolution for internal insurgency

The line of defence is the local forces and the primary objective before the attack is defence. The unified action of the three forces will then be objective to protect the citizen from any threat that compromises their safety no matter what threat arises. The coordinated efforts of the forces will be backed by political, diplomatic, and national interests that are transparent. These unifying efforts will be the ultimate action from the state to protect its citizens.

Technology and AI-based threats

Crimes that pose a threat to citizens or the nation on any scale will have to face tangible consequences while the state will initiate the actions to neutralize the threat first. Nuclear weapons and policy-based stand of use

India has a no-first-use policy that prevents the nation from initiating an attack with nuclear weapons. This does imply that the country will retaliate to a nuclear attack with a nuclear attack. The first use initiated by the third party will be returned with the same intensity or more. Defence and deterrence toward neighbouring countries

Deterrence is only to be displayed when the need arises and the nation finds within itself the power to display power and influence to external parties.

Global affairs and policy-based stands of support

The early identification of global-level threats and neutralizing them is the objective of the state when external or international threats are concerned. The need for presenting the issue to a larger committee like the UN would be ideal and the state forces will identify and find methods to coordinate efforts to help limit the impact of the harm and protect the safety of the citizens would be the state's priority.

In global-scale panels and organizations, the support given to countries and the support India receives can be used to ensure better safety and diplomatic connections between the state and the nations concerned. Stands in support will be taken based on the larger network of alliances.

Co-ordinating intelligence and addressing threats

The forces of the state will actively pick up information and intelligence that will enable the state to proactively protect its citizens. The only forces that are allowed to intersect external communication are the state's forces for the best interest of the citizens while any private party accessing the same is considered a crime. The confidential intelligence from external sources will only be used to address the possible threats that may arise from pre-mediated actions to compromise the safety of the citizens.

The addressing of these threats proactively will only be done by the three forces of the nation and attack will not be the first but last resort in terms of upcoming external threats.

Risk management through diplomacy

The actions of attack will be communicated via the route of diplomacy before the attack is carried out as retaliation or as the first attack. The upcoming threats will be allowed to be discussed by people in power and ideally avoid attack. The risk of attack would be reduced if the external party is open to discussion. The upcoming could be neutralized via negotiation and political discussion. This is the stand that the long-term interest of the finance, resources, and the lives of the state's force and personnel would be considered when preparing to neutralize an external threat.

Threats that are detected early via diligent collection of intelligence have the potential to be neutralized without on-ground attacks from both parties.
