**Sample Parent Letter:**

## 3. Sample letter from Michigan Citizens: Detailed version

Detailed Advocacy Letter version with a message from you at the end:

#### THE PROBLEM

The latest scores for the National Assessment of Educational Progress showed only 32% of students in 4th grade score at or above the Proficient level. This was not much different from 2017-32% or 1998 - 28%. After spending millions of dollars many Michigan students are below grade level in reading and writing skills.

Many things impact this low performance

- inadequate screening for early reading difficulties
- inadequate teacher training
- early reading instruction that is not grounded in the science of reading
- the lack of consistent instructional practices that apply what science teaches us about how the brain learns to read

For children that struggle with dyslexia, these factors pose even greater risk.

#### THE SOLUTION

Passing legislation to address these issues is key to help children across Michigan fulfill their potential as proficient readers.

#### IF PASSED THE LEGISLATION WILL REQUIRE:

- Schools to identify children in grades K-3 that struggle with decoding and word recognition skills, indicative of dyslexia, using reliable and valid screening then using a 3-tiered framework of support to address these deficits
- Training for future and current educators about dyslexia and structured literacy instructional practices grounded in the science of reading
- Teachers to have the knowledge above to be certified or to recertify their licensure.
- The creation of an advisory board within the Michigan Dept. of Ed. that will develop or adopt a dyslexia guidebook for use by schools across Michigan
