POETRY OF LIFE ON EARTH

Purpose

Writing a poem to summarize what you've learned will help you remember the key points of this lesson.

Key information

A *haiku* is a traditional Japanese poem that has three lines of text. The first line has five syllables, the second has seven syllables, and the last line has five syllables. The lines of a haiku do not rhyme. Here's an example of a haiku about the beginning of the Universe.

Darkness, then a spark, boom! The Universe is born, stars shine in the sky.
