ABOUT HACKNEY QUEST

We are a youth and community charity, established in 1988 and our aim is to support young people aged 8-25 through our youth engagement, youth leadership, mentoring, volunteering, employment and counselling services. We provide a safe and trusted environment, good role models and opportunities for young people from all backgrounds to thrive and reach their potential.

As our programme continues to grow and engage more and more young people, the Youth Work Intern will support our Youth Manager with planning and delivering our youth programme. We recently expanded our youth programme and this would be an exciting time for an intern to be involved in its development. The role is varied including a wide range of activities including planning and development, direct youth work and will give the intern scope to bring their own passions and skills to the role.

AIMS OF THE ROLE

- Work directly with young people to help them overcome challenges and thrive.
- Assist in planning and delivering engaging youth activities alongside the youth work team.
- Support Hackney Quest's social media presence and youth engagement.
- Carry out administrative tasks to support the youth programme.
- Join the Jack Petchey Internship Programme, receiving professional development opportunities, training, and mentorship.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Support of the Youth Programme

- Assist in planning and developing three afternoon/evening youth sessions each week during term time, working closely with the youth manager, youth workers, and volunteers.
- Support the youth team and volunteers on trips and activities during school holidays, ensuring
 young people are engaged, safe, and have a positive experience.

- Collaborate with the youth manager to plan holiday programmes, including budget monitoring, contacting members, and creating activity forms and sign-up sheets.
- Contribute to the growth and management of Hackney Quest's social media presence.
- Foster good relationships with the youth work team, including youth workers and volunteers, to ensure a cohesive and supportive working environment.
- Communicate with young people and their families about upcoming sessions via WhatsApp/text and email.
- Maintain accurate attendance records and monitor progress using the Views CRM system.
- Ensure that risks are minimized through regular, thorough risk assessments and reporting.
- Support the implementation of HQ boundaries, behaviour expectations, and schemes of appreciation and awards.
- Encourage young people to explore their local community and beyond, supporting their personal growth and aspirations.
- Assist with the planning and coordination of food for weekly youth club sessions, including grocery shopping when necessary.
- Develop practical youth work experience and support at Hackney Quest, along with professional development through the Jack Petchey Internship Programme and personal training bursary.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- Participate in establishing good youth work practice with staff and volunteers, attending relevant training programmes for professional development.
- Assist in the promotion of Hackney Quest, its aims, and objectives.
- Attend monthly team meetings and contribute to discussions and planning.
- Represent Hackney Quest at relevant meetings and events as required.
- Take responsibility for your timekeeping, reflective practice, and administrative tasks.

- Experience (voluntary or paid) working with young people, particularly in community, educational, or youth settings
- Demonstrated commitment to supporting the personal development of young people

- Experience in planning and delivering youth engagement activities, events, or workshops
- Experience of working in diverse and underserved communities
- Experience collaborating with volunteers, schools, voluntary sector, or local authorities

Skills & Abilities

Essential:

- Strong interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to engage and build positive relationships with young people from a diverse range of backgrounds
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team
- Excellent organisational, administrative, and time management skills, with the ability to prioritise tasks effectively
- Creative problem-solving skills and adaptability in a fast-paced environment
- Digital and social media skills

Desirable:

- Group facilitation skills, especially for workshops or peer-led activities
- Knowledge of safeguarding and child protection procedures and policies

Personal Qualities

Essential:

- Passion for working with young people and supporting their development
- Positive and proactive attitude, with a strong willingness to learn and face new challenges
- Empathy and patience, especially in engaging young people facing personal or family challenges
- Commitment to Hackney Quest's values of equality, diversity, inclusion, community engagement, and youth empowerment

Additional Requirements

Essential:

- Commitment to Hackney Quest's mission to foster positive relationships between young people and the wider community
- Willingness to work evenings and some weekends as needed
- A valid enhanced DBS check (or willingness to undergo one)
