introduced the following bill, which was subsequently referred to the Senate.

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide for a higher threshold for the advice and consent of the nomination of Justices of the Supreme Court.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution;

“Article —

“**Section. 1.** For the purposes of the appointment of Judges of the Supreme Court only, the Advice and Consent of the Senate required in Article II, Section 2 of this Constitution shall be granted only if two-third of the Senators present concur.

"**Section. 2.** This amendment shall take effect immediately after the date of ratification."
