UNIVERSAL EXPECTATIONS: Be Kind, Be Safe, Be Responsible

NAME OF SKILL/SETTING: Appropriate Bathroom Behavior

EXPECTATIONS: Keep your eyes to yourself. Respect each other's privacy. Wash your hands with soap after using the bathroom. Notify an adult if the bathroom needs attention. Line up for drinking fountain along the wall. Voice Level 0. Flush. Place paper towels in garbage bin. Unlock the door. Use the bathroom during scheduled breaks.

PURPOSE OF THE LESSON/WHY IS IT IMPORTANT.

To maintain an environment that is safe, quiet and orderly and to be respectful of others.

TEACHING EXAMPLES FOR KICK-OFF/BOOSTER LESSONS

- 1. Explain the bathroom expectations and purpose listed above.
- 2. Students brainstorm ideas of times they may need to talk in the bathroom or notify an adult if the bathroom needs attention (such as out of toilet paper, the stall is dirty and the toilet won't flush).
- 3. You happen to be in the bathroom at the same time as your friend is. You want to stay and talk but instead you'll talk to them at recess.
- 4. Be sure to go to the bathroom at the scheduled time and appropriate place.
- 5. Make sure to use only one pump of soap and two paper towels. Make sure your use the soap dispenser from the front, never the side.
- 6. In the bathroom, your voice level should at level 0.
