Since the last online AGM event in November 2024, there have been 3 "in person" meetings wholly or partly organised by or on behalf of the MGMS. They were:

- The Young Modellers' Forum, 29th November 2024. Following the usual format, the annual YMF once again took place at Lady Margaret Hall in Oxford. This time, the talk prizes were awarded to Finlay Clark (Edinburgh), Michael Strobl (TU Dortmund) and Margaux Haon (Liverpool), and the poster prizes to Shubhangi Kandwal (Trinity College Dublin) and Aleksy Kwiatkowski (Oxford).
