So, how does the course work for both student and educator:

Firstly, the platform is mobile, tablet and smartphone friendly and all technically tested and supported by using a state-of-the-art eLearning platform. It is 21st century self-directed learning and it will take a huge load off the educators already stretched back! We are an experienced and trusted authority on delivering law workshops (over 10 years) and information in a age friendly appropriate manner.

The eLearning course is already proving to be a very attractive option to schools and educators as they are using it is an alternative to work experience, school trips/bus trips, community activities and added extra options for students as well as workshop options- and blended learning.
