- The National Scholarship Program covers tuition, incidental fees and residence fees for up to four years of study.
- Runners-up will receive Arbor Scholarships at a value of \$7,500 in the first year and \$1,500 per year for three additional years of undergraduate study.
- The scholarship is tenable only at the University of Toronto.

Eligibility

- Students must be:
 - a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person;
 - enrolled in their final year of Canadian secondary school or first-year CEGEP; and
 - planning to start university in the upcoming academic year (or planning to take a gap year)
- Students must be nominated by your school for the U of T
 National Book Award.
- Students must demonstrate superior academic performance,
 original and creative thought, exceptional achievement in a

broad context and have a strong involvement in the lives of their school and communities.
