	The U.S. has more guns per capita than any other nation, contributing to alarmingly high rates of gun homicides, mass shootings and suicides.
Background:	Every day in America, an average of 321 people are shot, according to <u>Brady United</u> , the country's oldest gun violence prevention group. Of that number, 111 die: 42 are murdered and 65 die by suicide; one is shot and killed by accident, another is shot by law enforcement and another dies of an undetermined cause. 23 minors are shot in the United States every day. Gun violence is a complex issue that takes many forms, and mass shootings make up only 1% of all gun violence in America. 60% of gun deaths are suicide and 37% are homicide, including the 1% of mass shootings.
	Despite overwhelming public support for measures like universal background checks and assault weapons bans, Congress has failed to act due to powerful lobbying by the NRA. Experts recommend closing legal loopholes, funding community-based interventions, and reinstating the assault weapons ban to reduce gun violence.
