John R Lewis High School Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) will offer up to two \$1000 scholarships to Lewis' seniors to assist with their post-secondary education plans. Consideration will be given to a Lewis 12th grader entering a college, university, or training facility. ***The student must be a current PTSA member*.**

Scholarship Criteria

- Academic Achievement (GPA and Academic Awards).
- Beyond Academic
 - Extracurricular Activities, Hobbies, or Special Interests;
 - Community Involvement and Volunteer Experiences;
 - Work Experiences.
- Name of the college, university, or training facility you are planning to attend in the fall.
- A brief statement on what has motivated you to continue your education/training beyond high school and why you have chosen your specific academic or career path.
- Written Narrative (250-300 words) answering the question below:
Reflect upon your years at Lewis HS, what have you learned about what it takes to be a good citizen at school and in your community. How do you think these lessons learned will serve you as you move onto life after high school?

The recipient must:

- Be graduating from Lewis in June 2026

- Have a GPA of 3.0 or better – please provide 7th semester academic transcript
- Submit the application and essay no later than May 1, 2026. Application is available at <https://sites.google.com/lewishsptsa.org/home/home>

Amount of Scholarship

The Lewis High School PTSA will award up to 2 scholarships each in the amount of \$1,000 each payable to the institution of higher learning.

Selection Process

The Lewis High School PTSA Scholarship Selection Committee will be responsible for reviewing all scholarship applications and selecting the final winner or winners of the PTSA Scholarships. The PTSA Scholarship Selection Committee will be made up of a designated team of PTSA members who do not have children applying for the scholarship. The selection will be a blind process, i.e., the selection committee will not know the names of the candidates until after the applications have been reviewed and winners selected.

Notification of the Committee's selection will be announced. All applicants must agree that the decision of the PTSA Scholarship Selection Committee is final and not open to appeal.
