Jonathan Zhao, 16, Pine Wood school. Excels both at soccer and at school, was diagnosed as CAEBV, a very rare disease, the 1st case at Stanford Children’s Hospital history. He went through 3 rounds of chemotherapy which were aimed at bone marrow transplant but unfortunately all failed and resulted in worse conditions, including admissions by ICU 2 times, 37 days in total. He is now at high risk with several important organs that can hardly tolerate any new pressures due to extra or severe medications. Permitted by the hospital, oriental medicine, qigong, food therapy etc., uncovered by insurance, are also integrated into the current treatment plans. Both his parents are taking care of him, full time.
