Method

This section describes the community engagement or empowerment approach adopted in the program, including the characteristics of the community partners involved, the stages of implementation, the materials or tools used, and the procedures for evaluating program outcomes and impact. The methodological description should clearly explain how the intervention was designed, implemented, and assessed to ensure transparency, accountability, and replicability of the community service initiative. Results and Discussion

Results and discussion should be presented in one integrated section. This section explains the implementation outcomes of the community engagement or empowerment program, including analysis of results, challenges encountered, and interpretation of findings in relation to relevant theories, prior studies, or best practices. Authors are encouraged to highlight the intervention's measurable impact, community response, and sustainability aspects.

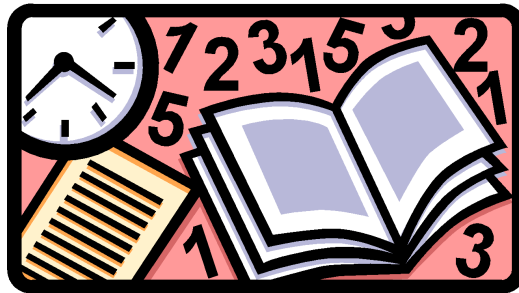


Figure 1. Example Image quality must be clear (*Times New Roman*, 8 pt)

Tables and figures should be placed close to the relevant discussion and must be clearly labeled and numbered consecutively using Arabic numerals (Table 1, Figure 1, etc.). Table titles should appear above the table, while figure captions should be placed below the figure. Equations may be included when relevant and should be numbered consecutively using Arabic numerals in parentheses aligned to the right.
