

OER Course Redesign Sprint - IECC Writing 120, Mt. Hood Community College

Course Description: This course is for non-native English speakers who need to improve academic writing skills. The primary focus is on following the writing process to produce three types of essays. It includes review and mastery of basic grammatical structures and mechanics as needed while introducing more complex structures of grammar. The course also offers practice of critical thinking and study skills in order to prepare students for the advanced IECC201W academic writing course at Mt. Hood Community College.

Main Course Objectives from Course Content and Outcomes Guides (CCOG):

1. Use the writing process to generate ideas, write, revise, and edit drafts of essays.
2. Write well-developed 4 – 5 paragraph essays that support a clear thesis.
3. Apply knowledge of high-intermediate English grammar and mechanics by self-editing writing.
4. Demonstrate the use of study skills and classroom behavior appropriate in a U.S. college setting
