

This document should be used as a planning tool for students intent on majoring in dance. Dance major students must consult with a Dance Faculty Advisor when planning their dance schedules.

IN ESSENCE: Fulfilling the Dance Major Requires:

1. The successful completion of a minimum of 10.5 designated course credits.
2. The design of an Area of Specialty and completion of a Senior Dance Capstone Project.
3. Participation in a range of co-curricular dance department offerings, including a minimum of three semesters in one of the student dance companies (Companydance[®] and Veselica International Dance Ensemble[®]).
First-year dance students and/or students new to Companydance are strongly encouraged to participate in First Year Dance Project. More information is available from the Dance Department.
4. The attainment of technical proficiency in a primary genre of dance at the 200 level (expected) or 300 level (preferred) and proficiency in a secondary genre of dance at the 100 level.
5. The completion of a range of dance production work, including a minimum of one major dance production.

SPECIFICS: Fulfilling the Dance Major Requires:

1. **LANGUAGE INTENSIVE COURSES (7.0 Credits):** The dance major must complete all the following language intensive course credits (refer to suggested four-year sequence of courses below).

Term_____ Year_____	399 Senior Dance Seminar (1.0) Must be taken fall of senior year. Ideally, all required major courses completed prior to taking this class. Culminates in Senior Dance Capstone Project at the end of fall semester of senior year.

2. **MOVEMENT INTENSIVE COURSES (1.5 Credits):** The dance major must complete a minimum of 1.5 movement intensive course credits in at least two different genres (modern, Hip Hop, international, ballet, etc.) from the following list of classes. All movement intensive dance courses are repeatable. All movement intensive courses count towards the ACB (Active Body) Ole Core requirement and SPM (Studies in Physical Movement) GE requirement. We highly recommend that students take a West African movement intensive course during their first three semesters.

3. **AREA OF SPECIALTY (2.0 Credits):** Each dance major also designs an individualized Area of Specialty consisting of a minimum of 2.0 credits from within and/or outside the Dance Department.

The dance student's Area of Specialty is in essence the synthesis of a content area or theme and the selection of a project presentation option (the means for exploring the content area). The Area of Specialty leads to a Senior Dance Capstone Project, which is completed in conjunction with Dance 399 (Senior Dance Seminar: must be taken fall of senior year), and builds on the student's individual Area of Specialty.

*Students selecting the Choreography or Performance Senior Dance Capstone project option must complete Dance 374 Advanced Choreography prior to beginning their senior dance capstone project.

- DANCE TECHNIQUE PROFICIENCY:** Dance majors must achieve technical proficiency in level II (preferably level III) in a primary genre of dance (for example West African dance, ballet, modern, Hip Hop, international) and proficiency in level I in a secondary genre of dance.
- COMPANY PARTICIPATION:** Dance majors are required to participate in one of the student dance companies (Companydance© or Veselica International Dance Ensemble©) a minimum of three semesters. Participation must be planned in consultation with the dance faculty. Students selected to be a part of one of the dance companies will be registered for either Dance 170: Veselica (No credit course) and/or Dance 180: Companydance (no credit course) every semester they are involved.
