

# The Refugee Crisis in Myanmar

*The General Assembly,*

*Grieved* by the recent confirmations of the Myanmar government's violation of basic human rights, such as the right to private property and personal freedom, against ethnic minorities, in particular the Rhonigya community,

*Deeply concerned* about the extremist and violent actions of the Myanmar army, such as participation in sexual harassment against Rhonigya women, destruction of personal property, massacre of entire villages and taking part in brutalities performed on innocent civilians,

*Taking into consideration* the arrival of tens of thousands of Rhonigya people escaping Daw Aung San Suu Kyi's government in other nearby countries, especially Bangladesh, Indonesia, Malaysia and Thailand,

1. *Proposes* a special conference between the member states of the ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations), including the governments of India and Bangladesh, regarding the migrant crisis in the Western border of Myanmar with India,
2. *Urges* the United Nations to take action against Daw Aung San Suu Kyi and calls upon international non-governmental organizations to revoke her 1991-awarded Nobel Peace Prize, following the events in the Rakhine State, all of which were part of the aforementioned series of brutalities,
3. *Requests* the Myanmar government to come in terms with numerous representatives of the Rhonigya ethnic minority and cooperate for a peaceful future, free of discrimination and negative stereotyping, by:
  - a. Implementing anti-racist education in schools and foundations across the country,
  - b. Organizing public events to gain the people's support on the matter, while at the same time securing funds for a campaign to protect the Rhonigyas' human rights,
4. *Emphasizes* the importance of harmony and prosperity within Myanmar and points out that such a policy could lead to economic growth by:
  - a. Allowing the Rhonigya minority to participate in social activities, without violating their right of personal property
  - b. Incorporating the refugees into the country's human resources, therefore increasing production of goods across the Indian Republic
5. *Decides* to remain seized of the matter
