D. 2019-2020 Goals adopted by CSL Ecosystem:

- 1. Provide opportunities to develop relevant employability skills in students of the CSL region.
- 2. Build greater community awareness about the variety of today's career options and pathways in STEM.
- **Parent Tool-kit** Eric Lech no update at this time.

The opportunity is to develop relevant employability skills in students of the CSL region/next steps in the parent tool-kit.

C. Grants 2019-2020

- New Teacher in the Workplace Advanced Grant Mary Kovalchick- The Ecosystem is planning to submit aligned Teacher in the Workplace grants in both the Pocono Counties and the Luzerne/Schuylkill WIAs. The project at this time seeks to develop school-wide STEM Coach/Mentors, prioritizing participation from teachers who are both SHINE OST and district IST teachers. The 36-40 hour program will take place two days during the summer, 3-4 days during the fall, and then 1-hour long webinars during the spring. The program would be similar to past teacher in the workplace programs with visits to employers, CTEs, etc. An additional component will be coaching instruction. Instruction will be carried on through the IUs. We wanted to make sure that this seems feasible to the group and to ensure support for the project.
- Update Book Project Mary Kovalchick- Unfortunately, LCCC was not awarded this grant.
- PA SMART Advancing Grant Ty Yost discussed the PA SMART grant and ideas about gathering information about the SHINE Makerspaces. We looked at ways to connect these programs to the CSL STEM Ecosystems Advancing Grant and improve our landscape for IST and OST programs. One of the key components we had discussed was around makerspaces in underserved schools. Knowing that SHINE makerspaces serve as the "model" for functional makerspaces he requested details about the makerspaces SHINE currently has so we can create a standard to use for the grant. This would include any key equipment, as well as the must haves for the spaces you utilize. The other key detail is the locations of current makerspaces in the schools. Since SHINE and PASmart prioritize underserved

populations we discussed how to be strategic and look for schools who will be good partners and benefit both the IST and OST STEM programs.

D. Expansion of the CSL STEM Ecosystem

• Follow-up on expansion – Jeanne Miller updated the group that IU19 will become part of the new Ecosystem called "NEPA" and it covers Lackawanna, Susquehanna, and Wayne. They will still be a part of CSL because of the participation in the Wayne County SHINE program.

E. STEM National Community of Practice

• Update discussion about PA statewide ecosystem. The statewide systems has been meeting monthly to discuss a convening for PA State Ecosystems. PDE is partnering with Labor and Industry, the Office of Administration, the Workforce Command Center, and the Governor's Office to host the 3rd Annual Code4PA event. This year's event will engage business, industry, post-secondary and for the first time high school students in the Hackathon. We want to get the information for the event out through the ecosystems and try to engage partners across the Commonwealth. Stay tuned there is more to come.

- Dr. Grieco/Jeanne Miller spoke with Judd Pittman @ PATTAN for a recorded podcast. Once available we will share with the group.
- Heather Mullen shared with the group her new position at The United Way of the Greater Lehigh Valley where they received a planning grant to identify the needs of the Carbon County School Districts and identify some areas where they can place an AmeriCorps Service Member.
 Part of her role is to assess education needs, as well as the needs of community based organizations in Carbon County to determine how AmeriCorps members could be used to impact and expand educational opportunities for students in Carbon County.
- Melissa Turlip, Program Manager from Common Wealth Charitable Management
 CommonwealthCharitable.org discussed the Mobile Oilfield learning Units (MOLU). This
 traveling exhibition is run by the Oilfield Energy Center that teaches students in grades 5-8 about
 science, technology, and careers related to the oil and natural gas industry through hands-on,
 educational activities.
