

Hey team,

We're pleased to announce the schedule and some details around Smoke on the Coast's rules, hand in schedule and cooking guidelines.

There are a number of key points and expectations that you and your team members need to be aware of for this event as it is a **"open to the public"** event.

### **Bump In & Bump out.**

**Whilst bumping in and bumping out all teams must wear closed toe shoes and hi-vis vests – you will get turned away if you don't have either item.**

Bump in will (formally) commence at **2pm** on **Thursday 23rd June** and all teams must be bumped out prior to **10am Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April**. Speak to Derrick (021629327) if this is not practical for your team or you wish to add additional days to your stay.

Sites are booked for SotC from 12pm Thursday 23rd June to 10am Sunday, so please arrive in your own time. SotC management & NZBA will be available on-site from 2pm Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Bump out will be **from 5pm** on the **Saturday 25th**.

You can start to tidy and pack your area however all Marquees/Gazebos will need to remain up until **4pm**. No vehicles will be allowed off-site till after this time. Bump-out is not required until 10am Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> – so take your time.

The site is fully on **grass** – so please note that all teams must use appropriate weights or pegs to secure their tents/Gazebos! This will strictly be enforced. You must use a suitable marquee to withstand weather conditions that may arise at these types of events. We are unable to supply Gazebo weights sorry, please bring your own.

As this is a public event there is an expectation that you keep your site tidy and ensure cooking activities do not leave any permanent marks or damage to the camp-site – Please bring some form of heat shield for charcoal starter's so grass IS NOT DAMAGED.

Also please do not set up your area in a way that looks like a walled cell block! The public want to be able to see activity not a tent wall.

### **Team Briefing**

This will occur at **8.30am** Saturday in/outside the Recreation room (Command centre!)

You will be provided hand in trays, spoons & proteins at this meeting and we will cover expectations and timings of the competition.

Hand in schedule/order will be confirmed & a time-check undertaken

This is when you will select (Kids) Burger mince, Pure South Steak, Swift Brisket & be distributed Swift Ribs

The SCA & Kids cooking window will open immediately afterwards

### **Team site inspection**

For NZBA this will occur from **4.30pm Saturday 25th**.

(There is no formal SCA site inspection however SCA Head judges may visit sites to ensure compliance)

You are required to have the following as part of your team area:

- Fire extinguisher
- first aid kit,
- suitable food safety handling items (Synthetic gloves, hand sanitiser, table coverings and cleaning products
- Ice to over any uncooked meat in a suitable cooler at all times (to below 4° c)

## Alcohol on site

This is a public event and the inside site is a public space – this means that all team members will need to adhere to normal alcohol service rules and regulations around intoxication. If you are visibly showing signs of intoxication, you will be removed from the venue! Teams will also need to respect other people on site regarding noise.

The cooking area is not licensed, and we request that you do not openly consume alcohol in this space. Any teams found to be flouting this request will be asked to vacate the premises and be ejected from the competition.

**Drug use will not be tolerated on site** – Security will be always onsite and if any team is caught with or using hard drugs they will be removed from the comp (This is non-negotiable) and face being banned from future events.

## Site Plan

Will be sent out separately to this email.

Please note that spaces will not be allocated to teams – we will allocate you space during bump in.

Your sites are approx. **8mx10m wide** so please stay within this allotted space. NOTE: this is a larger size than most comps and allows for more comfortable sleeping arrangements.

All sites will come with power supplied 240v 10amp but you will require a Caravan conversion plug

Can you please let me know if you are a team using a trailer pit - we have special locations for extra-large pits?

### Amenities

Toilets are inside the venue (60-80m walk) and will be available to all teams.

There will be washing up facilities provided and a hot-ash can for ash disposal.

All Grey water must be contained and emptied at the appropriate grey water facility on site – this will be clearly advised on site.

### Lighting

There is some outdoor flood lighting however please bring your own lighting for lighting your own space.

### Electrical equipment

**All electrical leads and equipment MUST be tested and tagged – we will be inspecting this on site so please ensure you are using approved and tagged gear.**

**This is a public event so if your equipment is not tested or tagged it will not be allowed to be used – we will be enforcing this rule heavily.**

### First Aid

We will have a first aid person on deck for both days of the event.

They will be on call at night for any emergencies.

Each team will need to have their own first aid kit on site as well.

### Fire Safety

All teams are required to bring a fire extinguisher – this must be in working order.

### Rubbish

We will have Charcoal disposal facilities available.

**There is a 9m<sup>3</sup> Skip on site for rubbish – please help us minimise waste and break it down to allow for all waste to be taken in the skip.** There is also a recycling centre for cans, glass and cardboard – please do not dispose of these in the Skip.

**Please do not leave anything behind on your site when you leave.**

You must leave your space as you found it! Clean all ash/charcoal and dispose of it in the provided facilities.

## **Covid 19**

Below is an indication of the rules as they stand at the time of publishing and may be changed without notice if we are forced by Government or council changes.

### **Whangateau Camp Rules:**

#### **1 DO WE NEED A VACCINATION PASS?**

- 2 Yes. The health and safety of our staff and customers is the council's top priority as we begin to reopen more of our services and facilities, and we need to do all we can to keep customers and our staff safe while on site.
- 3 As such we have made the decision to require vaccination passes at all our holiday parks (Martins Bay, Whangateau and Ōrewa) and Waiheke Backpackers Hostel for **anyone aged 12 years 3 months and over**, unless they have a medical exemption approved by the Ministry of Health.
- 4 We have reached this decision because once people are in our facilities, despite measures in place to help reduce any potential spread such as mask wearing and physical distancing requirements in communal areas, we won't be able to prevent contact with other guests and staff. This is especially important for those under 12 or medically exempt who can't be protected by the vaccine.

### **SotC Covid plan**

- 5 Smoke on the Coast will only go ahead if New Zealand is at Orange light Level or below with maximum capacity of 100ppl; this will be determined on first come first served (at 4 members max per team) based on date of entry.
- 6 All guests and competitors are responsible for their own social distancing. Smoke on the Coast is an outdoors activity with low risk of transmission
- 7 All competitors are required to provide H&S AND Covid 19 PPE for use should our Territory be elevated to RED LIGHT level during the running of the event. The event shall be cancelled immediately should the alert level be raised to RED LIGHT level.  
If the event is cancelled all entry fees and accommodation costs will be refunded.
- 8 In the event Auckland Council, the owners of the venue, require visitors to either prove double vaccination status or require negative tests, the Promoter will require entrants to comply.
- 9 The Promoter requires teams and visitors to comply with all legally required or council stipulated Covid 19 measures. Failure to do may lead to ejection from the event
