Exploration in the science of archaeology at Elden Pueblo for 3rd to 8th grade. This program ties well to the 3rd grade history component, plus other Arizona standards from 3rd through 8th grade. [Humans as Part of the Environment – 4th-8th grades – Fieldtrip - Elden Pueblo - Free to Classes](#)

This is a ¾-mile hike along the Arizona Trail and near the Pueblo to investigate human impact on the landscape, while studying the local history. Students compare the effects of road building and fire management over time by visiting nearby areas to track tree, shrub and grass regrowth. Explore what a healthy forest should look like and the impact of man-made travel routes. This program is well suited for Native American youth, as we explore history without physically being on the ruins site. Ties to middle-school curriculum standards in math, science and social studies. Could also work for progressive 4th & 5th grade classes.
