S.R. 2401: A Resolution To Create Formal Student Infrastructure Committees for Academic Success

Legislative Executive Summary

Infrastructure is fundamental to the students at the University of Texas at Austin. Currently, many discussions on campus among faculty and administrators regarding infrastructure developments are ongoing. To ensure that these developments best impact students, it is vital to have student voices in these discussions wherever possible. This legislation calls for the establishment of a Student Infrastructure Committee (SIC) for each College.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Why create a Student Infrastructure Committee (SIC)?

A: Infrastructure directly impacts the lives of students at the University of Texas at Austin. Thus, it is important to have student liaisons directly involved in these conversations. There is no regulated precedent for this thus far. Having these committees will allow for a direct pipeline of student feedback about infrastructure to administration. Ideally, the committees will be composed of students from various majors, backgrounds, and experiences, thus providing many perspectives on which infrastructure projects to invest in to maximize student academic success.

Q: How would these committees act?

A: Administrators would convene committees as needed for projects where student feedback can reinforce decision-making. The committee should be consulted namely for the ideation Funding for Small Academic Renovation Projects (80/20) Program, but it can also serve as a consultant for other projects.

Q: How would these committees be assembled?

A: Theoretically, a committee should be established in each College. Establishment should be facilitated by each College's *Associate Dean* for Facilities (or equivalent, henceforth) but may be delegated if necessary. By the Associate Dean's discretion, application processing can either 1) be led by the *Associate Dean* themself or 2) be delegated to the College's Council. A call for members should be issued annually (at the beginning of the academic year's Fall Term). Members may not serve more

than one year to allow for new perspectives. The number of seats given is at the discretion of the *Associate Dean* for Facilities.

Infrastructure is crucial for facilitating academic success. Without clean, spacious architecture, coupled with plentiful facilities such as study spaces, collaborative areas, and lounges, evidence shows that academic success is found to decline¹. Furthermore, student testimonies collected by the Natural Sciences Council regarding the Physics, Math, and Astronomy (PMA) building detail the impact of poor infrastructure on the academic experience of students². A student infrastructure committee will standardize much-needed student input in the many discussions regarding infrastructure across our campus.
