Drive Movie Review:

In the movie "Drive", a Hollywood stunt driver (Ryan Gosling) moonlights as a free wheelman who then finds himself and his solitary life taking a whole new meaning after meeting Irene (Carey Mulligan). Irene was the wife of a convicted criminal, Standard (Oscar Isaac). They had a son called Benicio (Kaden Leos). Standard was then released from prison and forced into committing a daytime robbery. Driver offered services to help Standard get away from the criminal world, but things got complicated.

Then, the robbery went unexpectedly distorted and the Driver barely managed to escape alive. When the take from the job proved to be higher than the Driver believed it was, it became apparent that everything was set up. Thugs then threatened to kill Irene and Benicio, and all evidence pointed that the masterminds of this were Bernie Rose (Albert Brooks) and Nino (Ron Perlman). From there, things got really bloody and complicated as Driver and the gangster played the violent game of following and trying to catch each other. This unleashed a terrible side of Driver no one expected to see.

The thematic elements in this movie were used in an interesting, eye-catching manner. I think the main 3 thematic elements in this movie were music, dialogue, and acting.

- Music:

I really enjoyed the music in this movie. Actually, one of the main reasons why I chose to watch this movie was because of the music. The soundtrack had an 80's throwback vibe to it. I really liked this. It was really smooth, yet mysterious and interesting. Just like the movie.

-Dialogue:

-Acting:

The casting for this movie was amazing. They chose the perfect person to play the role of Driver. Ryan Gosling managed his character really well. He seems like a mysterious, calm person. Someone who seems like he would never hurt anyone, but actually unleashes a terrible side of him throughout the movie. Irene was also a mysterious character, like Driver. They looked good together. Also, Standard's character caught my attention. He had a foreign accent and the way he moved and talked made me believe that he really was a criminal who came from the streets. The five most important scenes in the film were:

- 1. The scene where Driver parks his car across the street and nods to two men who had masks on and were carrying guns. He then arrives at the Staples Center, gets out of the car and blends in the crowd, leaving the two men in the car. I loved this scene. This was important because it finally revealed who he was.
- 3. When Driver is working at Shannon's garage and Irene and Benicio arrive with her car on a flat-bed. Shannon teases the Driver for having a "girlfriend." He uses that as an excuse for Driver to drive her and her son home. The Driver takes them on a ride through LA. This scene was so romantic and cute. The music played a really important role because it set the whole romantic mood. We also discovered that they liked each other.

- 4. When the Driver and Blanche find a hotel room and hide out from Cook. Then, Driver slaps Blanche and orders her to tell him about Cook. She tells him where he works and goes to the bathroom. Then, she gets shot. The Driver goes to the front door and kills the man in the bathroom before shooting the other man. This scene revealed a totally different side of him. Everyone was shocked. It was a really violent scene. We never expected Driver to be like that. Ryan's acting was amazing.
- 5. The very last scene where the Driver kills Bernie. He then drives off to Los Angeles. Irene listens to the Driver's message. The Driver keeps driving. No one knows what his fate will be. The screen slowly fades into black. This left us thinking about what will happen next. It was so mysterious and we're all curious about it. It was really cool how the music played while the screen faded into black.

Drive has multiple story lines. The most compelling was how he fell in love with Irene. This changed everything. It made us see two different sides from Driver. At first, he seemed like a really cold person who never talked, but then he talked to Irene, kissed her, and seemed really passionate about her. Also, thanks to the fact that he wanted to protect the person he loved, he revealed his dark side when he killed all the criminals.

I loved how these multiple story lines were woven together. They were two completely different story lines and they were put together in such an amazing way. This movie was really violent and bloody, but romantic at the same time. Such an interesting combination!

The most important relationship in this film was the relationship between the two main characters.
