Protection Arrangements:

- All electrical equipment to hold current test and tag
- After hours first aid provider on site at all times & identified to all participants

- Max 20kg lift for single person
- PPE to be worn by all participants during:
 - o Bump in (Friday 24th April 1200hrs-2200hrs) and;
 - o Bump out (Sunday 26th April before 10.00hrs)

ALL COMPETITORS:

- Must be double vaccinated and prepared to show vaccine pass plus scan Covid-Tracer App QR Codes on entry to event
- All electrical equipment to hold current test and tag; e.g. work lights, leads and multi boxes
- Hot coals to be managed and removed from site by competitor
- Each team to have a functional fire extinguisher and First Aid Kit
- Meat to be kept under ice at all times prior to cooking
- Site inspections take place prior to cooking window opening
- All rubbish must be taken away by teams

Description of the Work / Identify Significant Hazards / Controls - Event employees and volunteers

a. **Covid 19**

- b. Smoke on the Coast will only go ahead if New Zealand is at Yellow light Level or below with maximum capacity of 100ppl; this will be determined on first come first served (at 4 members max per team) based on date of entry.
- c. All guests and competitors are responsible for their own social distancing. Smoke on the Coast is an outdoors activity with low risk of transmission
- d. All competitors are required to provide H&S AND Covid 19 PPE for use should our Territory be elevated to RED LIGHT level during the running of the event. The event shall be cancelled immediately should the alert level be raised to RED LIGHT level. If the event is cancelled all entry fees and accommodation costs will be refunded.
- e. In the event Auckland Council, the owners of the venue, require visitors to either prove double vaccination status or require negative tests, the Promoter will require entrants to comply.
- f. The Promoter requires teams and visitors to comply with all legally required or council stipulated Covid 19 measures. Failure to do may lead to ejection from the event

2 Trips, slips

- wear appropriate covered footwear, no jandals/flip-flops

- Clean all spills, follow all signage and speed limits. Note exits, assembly areas and fire extinguishers.
- -Do not block driveways or road access,
- -Follow all rules and posted signage within properties.
- -Appropriate footwear to be worn in and around all properties.
