

AHS Tennis - Challenge Match and Ladder Overview

- All of the players will be placed on a ladder. This ladder is determined by last year's lineup and observations from summer, tournament results, UTR, etc.
- New people to the AHS tennis program will start at the bottom of the ladder. They will be organized by graduation year and sorted alphabetically by last name.
- We will have some players play singles challenge matches. These players will be competing for the three varsity singles spots.
 - YOU MUST BEAT A RETURNING SINGLES PLAYER TWICE TO OVERTAKE THEIR SPOT
- The majority of players will be in doubles groupings. Each day, players will go through doubles rotations. They will play 8 games and rotate partners. They will eventually play with the other three players in their group for a total of 24 games.
 - The player with the most number of games will move up a group and the player with the lowest score will move down a group.
 - When determining the final spot(s) for varsity and JV Gold, observation, partner chemistry, and other factors will play a factor as well.
 - Depending on weather, sunlight, and pace of play, some players may be asked to play no-ad scoring, mini sets to 4, etc.
- Players in convention for singles positions on varsity and JV Gold will be playing singles matches. These matches are 2 out of 3 set matches with regular scoring.

Team structure:

Varsity - 11 players

JV Gold - 11 players

JV Black - 24 players
