Make contact (see below) to offer a presentation to introduce students to climate economics, MIT's En-ROADS global climate policy simulator, and a high-impact climate solution project that students may wish to consider. For high schools, you can also contact the office that administers community service hours to propose that they include the CFD Movement project in their suggested activities (a CCL volunteer would oversee and sign off on the hours). You can also reach out to any student you know to see if they are interested in passing the idea on to a club at their school that might be interested.
