- 1. Thomas Hobbes was an English scholar and philosopher
- 2. Wrote on many topics including math and government
- 3. Asks the question: Why do we have government?

Slide 2:

- 1. Hobbes say humans as quick to fight / naturally selfish
- 2. State of nature: Everyone has the right to everything
- 3. People constantly at war with others

Slide 3:

- 1. Social contract: Between people and their government
- 2. Hobbes thought people agreed to give up some rights and power in exchange for protection
- 3. He believed that once the people agreed to hand over power in exchange for protection, they lost the right to overthrow, replace, or even question the government.

Slide 4:

- 1. Hobbes wrote Leviathan to explain how he thought governments should work.
- 2. Believed a strong central authority was the only way to avoid the evils of war
- 3. Believed a single sovereign, or ruler, should have total authority over the people
- 4. Monarchy with a single ruler was best

1. John Locke is another philosopher

- 1. An Essay Concerning Human Understanding, took over 18 years to write
- 2. Tabula rasa: which means a blank slate or page.
- 3. As you go through life and experience things the pages fill up

Slide 7:

- 1. Natural rights: Life, liberty, and property
- 2. Believed the purpose of government is to end the state of nature and give people certain protections.

Slide 8:

- 1. Government is only valid based upon social contract that is agreed upon by both sides
- 2. The people agree to give up some freedoms, if the government agrees to protect everyone's rights.
- 3. If the government fails to deliver, the people have the right to revolt
