#### What is OASL's State Conference?

• The OASL State Conference is a two day, one night, state-wide event for all schools that hold membership in the Ohio Association of Student Leaders. The election of the student and adult representatives to the Executive Board, keynote speaker(s), small group workshops, and other interactive activities highlight our State Conference.

#### Who Can Attend?

- Any OASL member school student currently in grades 6-12.
- Not a member school? If you are not a member, it is easy to sign up on our website for only \$100 a year and obtain many other member benefits.

#### What is the cost?

- The cost per student and advisor is \$90 (includes meals, programming, shirt and entertainment)
- This does NOT include the hotel accommodations that must be arranged by your school/individually (See hotel options included in this information packet.)

#### How Do You Register?

- Official Registration will open on January 6 and close on February 28 at 5 PM.
- Visit <u>oasl-oh.org/register</u> to complete the on-line registration form. Students and advisors must complete their forms individually
- Included in registration will be the signing of Assumption of Risk, Release, Consent, & Waiver Forms for attendees and their guardians

Is your school paying the whole amount or a portion of the registration?

You must include a valid Purchase Order Number with your registration. Please be sure you
have this before attempting to submit your registrations and the email of the advisor/teacher
associated with the PO.

#### Overnight/Hotel Accommodation/ Travel Information

Do we have to stay at the hotel or can we drive in each day?

- Staying at the hotel is not a requirement of the conference. This is left up to the attending advisor and school's discretion.
- OASL Staff will check in students at the beginning of each day's start of conference to ensure
  all individuals are accounted for. Advisors should communicate to the OASL in the event a
  student has to leave early.

Hotel Accommodations - Students and Advisors who require lodging on Friday night

## State Conference Advisor Checklist

There are many moving pieces to our annual State Conference! Beyond your attendance, there are several opportunities of which we hope you will take advantage. ADMINISTRATION & BOARD OF EDUCATION APPROVAL
School districts have varying procedures and timelines for getting overnight field trips approved. Work directly with your administration to make sure you have completed any necessary steps to get the trip approved. A tentative agenda is available in this packet to help.
PURCHASE ORDERS
Submit a Purchase Order Requisition for Registration Fees – follow your district's procedures so you will have the P.O. # when completing your registration forms. If you are unable to get a purchase order until you've registered students, please enter "000000" on the purchase order field in the registration form, and bring a copy of the actual Purchase Order with you to State Conference.
SELECT & REGISTER STUDENTS & ADVISORS, DUE FEB 28, 5 PM
We strongly encourage you to use the Advisor and Student Planning Docs linked earlier in this document to assist with registrations.
BOOK HOTEL ROOMS, ROOM BLOCK CLOSES FEB 14
OPTIONAL: SELECT A STUDENT TO RUN FOR BOARD OF REPRESENTATIVES, DUE FEB 14
