Written Evidence: the written components that accompany the student's works of art and design

<u>Visual Evidence</u>: the visual components that make up the student's works of art and design

Skills: abilities

Rudimentary: emerging or undeveloped

Moderate: adequate

Good: proficient

Advanced: highly developed

2D Skills: use of two dimensional elements and principles - point, line, shape, plane, layer, form, space, texture, color, value, opacity, transparency, time; unity, variety, rhythm, movement, proportion, scale, balance, emphasis, contrast, repetition, figure/ground relationship, connection, juxtaposition, hierarchy

<u>3D Skills</u>: use of three dimensional elements and principles - point, line, shape, plane, layer, form, space, texture, color, value, opacity, transparency, time; unity, variety, rhythm, movement, proportion, scale, balance, emphasis, contrast, repetition, figure/ground relationship, connection, juxtaposition, hierarchy

<u>Drawing Skills</u>: use of mark-making, line, surface, space, light and shade, composition

Materials: physical substances used to make works of art and design

Processes: physical and conceptual activities involved with making works of art and design

<u>Ideas</u>: concepts used to make works of art and design (that can be evident visually or in writing)

Relationships: connections

<u>Unclear</u>: not easily observable, discernable or legible

Inconsistent: not demonstrated in the same way or to the same degree across works of art and design

Identify: indicate of provide information

Synthesis: coalescence/integration of materials, processes, and ideas
