<b>Learner Context:</b>	<p>Learners show a strong preference for visual stimuli and often engage with digital art through social media. While many demonstrate a high interest in modern aesthetics, there is a noted gap in connecting these styles to traditional roots. A segment of the class struggles with abstract concepts, requiring concrete examples and scaffolding during discussions.</p>	<p>The class responds exceptionally well to rhythmic and melodic activities. Some learners exhibit barriers in articulating complex comparisons in English, necessitating the use of graphic organizers. There is a general curiosity about K-Pop and P-Pop, which can be used as a bridge to broader SE Asian contemporary arts.</p>	<p>Learners are currently experiencing high academic demands, and some have expressed anxiety regarding peer pressure. While they are empathetic, some find it difficult to talk about mental health due to cultural stigmas. They prefer hands-on activities over long lectures to maintain focus.</p>	<p>Learners thrive in collaborative, creative tasks. Mixed-readiness levels allow for peer-to-peer mentoring where more proficient artists help those who find visual expression challenging. Their interest in social media 'trends' can be channeled into positive advocacy.</p>

	Learners will view a digital collage of contemporary murals from Bonifacio Global City (BGC) and traditional weaving patterns, identifying which elements feel 'modern' versus 'traditional.' <b>Flow:</b>	<p><b>1. Scaffolding:</b> The teacher introduces the concept of 'Contemporary Art' using local examples like the works of Ronald Ventura or Leeroy New. <b>2. Active Retrieval:</b> Using a 'Quick-Fire' round, students recall traditional art forms they learned in previous grades. <b>3. Social Learning:</b> In small groups, learners analyze how a specific mural or installation reflects Filipino values like 'Bayanihan' or 'Resiliency.' <b>4. Checks for Understanding:</b> The teacher uses 'Thumbs Up/Down' to verify if learners can distinguish between 'traditional' and 'contemporary' influences in sample images.</p>	<p><b>1. Scaffolding:</b> Teacher provides a Venn Diagram template to guide the comparison of performance styles (costume, music, movement). <b>2. Social Learning:</b> Students work in 'Regional Teams' to research a specific SE Asian modern dance or musical group. <b>3. Checks for Understanding:</b> 'Stop and Chat' breaks during video presentations where pairs discuss one unique feature they noticed. <b>4. Active Retrieval:</b> A 'Pop Quiz' matching instruments to their respective SE Asian countries.</p>	<p><b>1. Scaffolding:</b> The teacher defines mental health using the 'Health Triangle' model to ensure a safe vocabulary. <b>2. Active Retrieval:</b> Learners recall the 'Physical Health' topics from previous quarters and relate them to how the body feels when stressed. <b>3. Social Learning:</b> 'Case Study Circles' where groups read a scenario about a Filipino teen facing social media pressure and brainstorm supportive advice. <b>4. Checks for Understanding:</b> 'Exit Ticket' asking students to name two common adolescent concerns discussed.</p>	<p><b>1. Scaffolding:</b> Teacher demonstrates how symbols (like a seedling or a stormy cloud) can represent feelings. <b>2. Social Learning:</b> In 'Creative Collectives,' students choose between making a poster, a short poem, or a rhythmic chant that promotes mental health awareness through art. <b>3. Active Retrieval:</b> Students must explain which SE Asian or PH contemporary style influenced their chosen 'look' or 'sound.' <b>4. Checks for Understanding:</b> Peer feedback sessions using the 'Two Stars and a Wish' method.</p>

<b>Opportunities for integration:</b>	Integration with Araling Panlipunan through the discussion of historical context and social changes reflected in modern art. Integration with Values Education (EsP) by focusing on empathy, self-worth, and seeking help within the community. **Assessment.**

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**Ways Forward.**

<b>Reflections:</b>	Reflect on whether the visual aids effectively bridged the gap for learners with lower readiness levels. Did the use of local murals increase engagement? Assess the classroom climate; did students feel safe sharing? Are there specific concerns in the 'Stress Bucket' that require a follow-up with the school guidance counselor?	Did the integration of Arts and Health make the mental health topic more approachable? How did the hands-on activity accommodate the visual and kinesthetic learners?
