Jo and Laurie Behind the Curtain

WHAT IS HAPPENING?

New Year's Eve party. Jo has backed into a curtained window recess to hide her burnt dress. She finds someone else already there — the Laurence boy. Two young people who both feel out of place discover each other, and are immediately at ease.

Setting A curtained window recess at Mrs. Gardiner's party — the dancing room visible beyond the curtain	Time of day Evening — a party in full swing	Mood Warm surprise, instant ease — two kindred spirits finding each other	Indoor / outdoor Indoors — the recess, curtained off from the party
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CHARACTERS

Jo March, 15: tall, thin, in her maroon dress. Immediately frank and warm.
Laurie, ~16: curly black hair, brown skin, big black eyes. Slightly startled but immediately smiling. Also hiding.

MOOD & FEELING

Warm surprise and instant ease. Two people who both felt out of place, finding each other.

Party light coming through and around the curtain — warm and golden. The recess slightly dimmer.	Jo's maroon dress against the curtain. Laurie's dark coloring. The party light at the curtain's edge.
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MUST INCLUDE <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Jo and Laurie face to face in the recess — both slightly surprised✓ The curtain behind them — the party continuing beyond✓ Their instant ease and friendliness	MUST AVOID <ul style="list-style-type: none">✗ Do not make them look uncomfortable — the ease is immediate✗ Do not show the curtain fully closed — there is a sense of the party beyond
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YOUR CREATIVE FREEDOM

Whether Jo is just arriving or they are already talking — both are wonderful.

Jo Burns Meg's Hair

WHAT IS HAPPENING?

Jo has tried to curl Meg's hair with hot tongs for the party. The papers come off — and instead of ringlets, a row of little scorched bundles sits on the bureau in front of a horrified Meg. Jo stares at the disaster with guilty tears.

Setting	Focus
The bedroom — bureau, mirror, party preparations in chaos	Jo with the tongs and the row of scorched hair bundles; Meg's horrified face

CHARACTERS

Jo: holding the tongs, looking at the row of scorched bundles. Expression of guilty dismay.

Meg: at the mirror, seeing the frizzled forehead. Wailing.

Amy: in the background, smoothing her own curls with a superior air.

MOOD & LIGHTING

Domestic comedy at its most mortifying. The row of scorched bundles on the bureau is the disaster made visible.

MUST INCLUDE	MUST AVOID
<ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ The row of scorched hair bundles on the bureau✓ Jo with the tongs — guilty face✓ Meg at the mirror — frizzled forehead✓ Amy's superior expression in the background	<ul style="list-style-type: none">✗ Do not make Jo look cruel — she is sincerely remorseful✗ Do not forget Amy's self-satisfied air

YOUR CREATIVE FREEDOM

The bureau with its row of singed bundles is the key visual.

Jo and Laurie Dance in the Hall

WHAT IS HAPPENING?

Laurie discovers Jo can't dance because her dress is scorched, and proposes a private solution: they dance a grand polka in the long empty hall. The music comes from the party room. Two people having more fun than anyone at the party.

Setting The long empty hall outside the party room	Focus Jo and Laurie mid-polka in the empty hall
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CHARACTERS

Jo: tall, maroon dress, laughing and unselfconscious. She dances enthusiastically if not gracefully.
Laurie: dark and graceful, guiding Jo through the German step. Enjoying it as much as she is.

MOOD & LIGHTING

Pure joy — two people having more fun than anyone at the party.

MUST INCLUDE <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Jo and Laurie dancing in the empty hall✓ The empty hall — theirs alone✓ The energy and joy of the dance	MUST AVOID <ul style="list-style-type: none">✗ Do not make the dance formal or stiff — it is joyful and free✗ Do not show anyone watching — they are specifically alone
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YOUR CREATIVE FREEDOM

Whether you show mid-dance or the moment they collapse on the stairs afterward — both work.

Corner ornaments are square decorative illustrations that sit in the corners of chapter pages. Each is 1200 × 1200 px (4 inches), saved as a PNG with a transparent background. Keep it simple and clear — these are for artists of all ages, including young children. Draw one object or idea from the story. Make it bold and easy to see.

A Pair of Tight High-Heeled Party Slippers

WHAT TO DRAW

Draw a pair of elegant Victorian party slippers — high-heeled, low-cut, beautiful but clearly uncomfortable. These are Meg's party shoes that hurt her all evening!

INCLUDE

- ✓ A pair of high-heeled Victorian slippers
- ✓ Elegant but slightly precarious-looking
- ✓ Clearly fancy dress shoes

FEEL

Beautiful but a little painful — the price of being fashionable.

ARTIST TIP

Shoes look great from a slight side angle — you can see both the toe and the heel at once!

One Nice Glove and One Stained Glove

WHAT TO DRAW

Draw two long white party gloves side by side — one pristine and clean, one with a visible lemonade stain on it. The March girls wear one good glove and carry the other!

INCLUDE

- ✓ One clean white long glove
- ✓ One stained or crumpled white glove beside it
- ✓ Both clearly a pair

FEEL

A funny, clever solution to a small problem.

ARTIST TIP

Lemonade stains look great as a yellow-brown splotch — like a little watercolor wash!

A Pet Rat on a Sofa Arm

WHAT TO DRAW

Draw a small friendly pet rat sitting on the arm of a worn sofa. This is Scrabble, Jo's beloved rat who lives in her garret!

INCLUDE

- ✓ A small rat — bright-eyed and friendly, not scary
- ✓ Perched on a sofa arm — alert
- ✓ Clearly a beloved pet

FEEL

Cheerful and friendly — a very well-loved unusual pet.

ARTIST TIP

Pet rats have big round ears, a long thin tail, and bright curious eyes — they are actually very cute to draw!

A Row of Russet Apples

WHAT TO DRAW

Draw four or five round russet apples in a row — golden-brown, round, and a little imperfect. These are the apples Jo stores in her garret to eat while reading.

INCLUDE

- ✓ Four or five russet apples in a row
- ✓ Golden-brown color — not red
- ✓ Round and a little bumpy, not perfect

FEEL

Simple and satisfying — a private store of good things.

ARTIST TIP

Russet apples have a lovely warm golden-brown color — try mixing yellow and brown!

A Carriage in the Rain at Night

WHAT TO DRAW

Draw a closed Victorian carriage out in the rain at night. This is Mr. Laurence's carriage that takes the March girls safely home from the party.

INCLUDE

- ✓ A closed Victorian carriage — glass windows, clearly well-made
- ✓ Rain falling around it — suggest with diagonal lines
- ✓ A dark rainy night around it

FEEL

Safe and cozy inside, wet and dark outside — a kind rescue.

ARTIST TIP

Rain looks great as thin diagonal lines going the same direction — not too many, just enough to suggest a shower!
