Reading Challenge

Directions: You will be asked to complete two tasks while we are not in school. Please follow all instructions, and let me know if you have any questions or concerns.

Choose a book for independent reading. Your book should be at least 150 pages. If you do not have access to any books at this time, please email me, and I will send you some options. While we are out of school, you will participate in a reading challenge over your chosen book. You must choose at least 6 out of the 12 options listed below, take a photo, and write a thorough explanation describing how your photo relates to your book. Photos/videos must be uploaded to a Google Slide presentation and **submitted to Google Classroom no later than Monday, 3/30/20**. I encourage all photos to be taken at your residence as we should be mindful of why we are at home during these two weeks.

NOTE: We will vote on winners for bonus points when we return to school.

Photo Options:

1. Best character pose
2. Make a meal in honor of a character or culture represented in the novel.
3. Recreate a scene out of items in your room.
4. Take a video reading your favorite scene to a parent, sibling, or pet.
5. Find an object in your house that symbolizes a theme in your novel.
6. Recreate a scene in the book using the people who live with you. Freeze the scene and take a photo.
7. Create a meme using a family member (not yourself) and add your favorite line to the meme.
8. Find an object in your house that symbolizes the main culture in your book.
9. Make a prediction for the book after reading the first two chapters. Create your prediction in a creative way.
10. Rename the novel. Draw the name in a creative way.
11. Create an outfit the main character would wear. Take a picture of a family member or you wearing the outfit.
12. Choose another book on your shelf that one of the character's would read. Take a picture of the book.

Bonus Points: (5 points will be awarded to each individual that is voted #1 in each category.)

1. Most artistic pose
2. Most scholarly pose
3. Most unusual reading spot
4. Most comfy reading spot
5. Most hilarious reading pose
