

SDSU College of Health and Human Services College Council Stole Point Instructions

Stoles are worn at your commencement ceremony as a way to commemorate your academic and/or extracurricular achievements. For the College of Health and Human Services, we are fortunate to be able to give out a select number of stoles to graduating CHHS students. Please refer to the below questions for information on how to qualify for a stole for the 2021-2022 academic year, as well as the stole point record form.

What are stoles?

Stoles are sashes draped over your shoulders and are to be worn at graduation. An example picture of this year's CHHS stole is provided at the bottom of this document.

How do I qualify for a CHHS stole for the 2021-2022 academic year?

We will be employing a **point-based system** in qualifying for a stole this year, **based on participation in various CHHS events**. This year, only **graduating students** will qualify for a stole.

How many stoles will you give out?

We will be giving out **20** stoles this year. Each graduating student is eligible to qualify for one (1) stole. Therefore, the **top 20 point-earning seniors** will be granted a stole to wear at graduation.

What is the minimum number of points needed to be earned in order to qualify for a stole?

The minimum number of points needed to be earned is **15**.

How do I earn points?

By participating in CHHS and CHHSCC-related events and activities. Here's a comprehensive breakdown of how you can earn points:

Attending events held by CHHS student organizations	3 points per meeting	N/A	Refer to stole record form.
