



## French Café

## Aims: to learn about French café culture and language

Learn - watch the <u>BBC Bitesize lesson</u> to learn a bit about France & see how much you can remember. Draw a poster / create a fact file / prepare a short presentation.

Be creative - make a 2D or 3D picture of the Eiffel Tower (or another famous landmark) using straws, ice lolly sticks, lego, play dough or cocktail sticks and grapes! <u>Click here for 10 different ideas!</u> Use your artwork to decorate your café or as a placemat on the table if it's a picture.

**Listen** - enjoy the traditional sounds of a <u>French café</u> with this music. Why not set a café up at home?

Perform - choose a French song you have learnt this year, <u>learn one now</u> or make up your own one on a specific topic to a tune you know. Practise it, make up some actions & perform it at as entertainment at your café. Why not record yourself to hear how you sound speaking French?

Write (in English or French) - create a simple menu for a café. Or write an acrostic poem about <u>France</u>. Don't forget to include lots of pictures.

Make - read a recipe in English for <u>French toast</u> or <u>crêpes</u> and have a go at making them (or something else easy from your café menu). Look out for other French food at the supermarket and have this at your café (biscuits, croissants etc). Have a tasting session and see what you like most - can you say this in French?

Decorate & relax - create some bunting using the <u>French flag</u> or <u>write</u> <u>about yourself.</u>
