Section 2 – overview of tasks

Throughout your time here at Conservatoire EAST you will be expected to evaluate and reflect on your own skills and abilities and the areas you need to expand, develop and improve.

This summer task is your opportunity to identify the basis you will be starting from, so that you can then keep track of progress you are making whilst on the course.

For each Season production you audition for, and are then cast in, you will be expected to write about your skills starting point and the progress you have made, so this summer work will be very useful for you on the course.

There are 5 tasks in total.

The first 3 tasks will be carried out independently by you over the summer. They are written tasks and need to be emailed, as a single digital document* or shared link, to helena.rudd@easterneducationgroup.ac.uk before 09.00 of the deadline.

The fourth task is the performance / presentation task which will be carried out as part of the Induction process.

The fifth and final task can only be done once you have performed / presented your work. It is a written task and needs to be added to your saved digital document* and then shared with helena.rudd@easterneducationgroup.ac.uk before 09.00 of the deadline.

These 5 tasks form the beginning of your work for this unit; the remainder of this work will be covered in your technique classes and last for most of your first year.

Task 1 – my background and my skills

There are 2 parts to Task 1– make sure you do both parts.

Task 1a (approx. 500 words)

Explain your background and experience in performing / backstage theatre arts:

- Cover any involvement you have had in performing and backstage theatre arts both in and out of school e.g.
 - classes
 - workshops
 - qualifications
 - exams
 - experiences
 - performances
 - etc.

Explain – why you have chosen to study performing / backstage theatre arts at level 3 (A level equivalent) here at Conservatoire EAST:

- Cover
 - why you want to study performing and production arts
 - what particular pathway you want to follow and why [acting or musical theatre or technical theatre]
 - why you want to study here at Conservatoire EAST

Task 1b (approx. 500 words)

Based on the particular pathway you have applied for here at Conservatoire EAST [acting or musical theatre or backstage theatre arts] you will need to:

- identify the skills that you are bringing to the course:
 - **technical** e.g.
 - pointe work
 - breath control
 - vocal projection
 - QLab show control software
 - Eos lighting software
 - **performance** e.g.
 - facial expressions
 - emotional range
 - physical confidence

- musicality
- follow spot operator
- sound mixer and operator
- lighting operator
- o **any related or unusual skills** e.g.
 - circus skills
 - gymnastics
 - playing a musical instrument
 - fencing
 - martial arts
 - parkour / free-running
 - first-aid
 - machine sewing
 - carpentry / joinery

 - flexibility

Task 3 – Preparing and Rehearsing

- Carry out **ONE** of the following **THREE** practical tasks depending on the pathway you have chosen to study with Conservatoire EAST.
- Perform / present it on the 26th of August 2026 (Induction) in front of the whole group as part of your Induction.
- Provide any paperwork you have been asked for and present it in time for your performance / presentation – for some work you will be able to email it to helena.rudd@easterneducationgroup.ac.uk for other work you will need to bring it in as a hard copy.

Option 1 – Acting pathway

- Choose one of the Shakespeare monologues from the pack provided making sure you can explain why you think this character and speech are a suitable choice for you.
- In your digital document that you email to Helena, record the following information:
 - The name of the play from which your monologue is taken
 - The date it was believed to be written / first performed
 - The Act and Scene numbers that the monologue occurs in
 - The name of your character
 - An outline of your character's role in the play
 - The significance of your monologue, at this particular point, in the play
 - Who you are speaking to in your monologue (it may be another character or it may be to the audience)

- o Where you are, at this particular point, in the play (e.g. in a court room in front of a judge, e.g. in a palace, e.g. outside in a forest, e.g. outside in somebody's garden)
- o A brief explanation of why you have chosen this character and monologue
- Learn your speech so that you can confidently perform it, from memory, with clear characterisation
- Annotate your script to show your performance:
 - o 'blocking' (the movements and gestures you have decided on for particular words, lines or breaks), keep your staging simple
 - o intention / motivation for saying each of your lines (what are you trying to do to the person / people you are speaking to e.g. persuade, scare, convince, explain, gain sympathy etc.)
- Bring your annotated script with you on 26th August 2026 (Induction)
- Upload a photo of your annotated script to your Edublogs 'Induction Summer Work' page (once the course has started)

Option 2 – Musical Theatre pathway

- Choose a musical theatre song you connect with, which, in performance, will last no longer than 4 minutes. You may change the key of your song but not the melody.
- Print off a copy of the sheet music for your song
- You will also need a copy of your backing track as an MP3 / MP4 / WAV file and email it to tim.westerman@easterneducationgroup.ac.uk in advance of your performance.
- In your digital document that you email to Helena, record the following information:
 - o The name of the musical your song is taken from
 - o The date it was written / first performed
 - o A brief synopsis of the musical
 - o The Act and Scene that the song occurs in
 - o The name of your character
 - o An outline of your character's role in the musical
 - o The significance of your song, at this particular point, in the musical
 - o Who you are singing to in your song (it may be another character or it may be to the audience)
 - o Where you are, at this particular point, in the musical (e.g. in your bedroom, e.g. in a theatre, e.g. outside on a street, e.g. in heaven)
 - o A brief explanation of why you have chosen this musical, character and song. You need to be able to justify your choice of song, having considered casting, the character's emotional journey and the age of the character.
- Learn your song so that you can confidently perform it, from memory, with clear characterisation and simple staging
- Be prepared to sing your song to your backing track in Induction but you will need your sheet music for your first solo singing class
- Annotate your sheet music, to show your performance:
 - o 'blocking' (the movements and gestures you have decided on for particular words, lines or breaks), keep your staging simple
 - o intention / motivation for each of your lines (what are you trying to do to the person / people you are singing to e.g. persuade, scare, convince, explain, gain sympathy etc.)
- Bring your annotated sheet music and backing track with you on 26th August 2026 (Induction)

- Upload a photo of your annotated copy of your sheet music to your Edublogs 'Induction Summer Work' page (once the course has started)

Option 3 – Technical Theatre pathway

- Choose ONE of the following production options:
 - o Trainspotting the Musical
 - o My Neighbour Totoro
 - o Hamlet
- Design and create a scale model or maquette or prop of ONE of the following options from your chosen show:
 - o a character
 - o item of furniture
 - o set piece (a piece of set)
 - o prop
- Prepare a design board (minimum A3 sized) which covers the following information:
 - o The name of the character / item of furniture / set piece / prop that you have chosen
 - o The name of the stage production it appears in
 - o The date it was first written / performed on stage (NOT the TV or animated versions)
 - o A brief synopsis of the story
 - o A brief explanation of why you have selected this production and this item
 - o A brief explanation of what purpose the scale model / maquette / prop serves
 - o A brief explanation of what scale your item is in and why
 - o Please provide test samples if applicable
- Prepare a short presentation about this project lasting 2 - 2 ½ minutes
- In your digital document that you email to Helena, record the following information:
 - o The name of the character / item of furniture / set piece / prop that you have chosen
 - o The name of the stage production it appears in
 - o The date it was first written / performed on stage (NOT the TV or animated versions)
 - o A brief synopsis of the story
 - o A brief explanation of why you have selected this production and this item
- Upload a photo of your A3 design board to your Edublogs 'Induction Summer Work' page (once the course has started)
- Please include any references from previous work available to you

Research (& Planning)

Distinction Independently identified, thorough and sustained research and investigation of a range of relevant sources, insightful interpretation and synthesis of information used to inform, support and develop ideas.

Task 4 - Performing and Presenting

Perform / present your summer work to your peers and tutors as part of the Induction activities starting 26th August 2026 (Induction).

Option 1 – Acting pathway

- Shakespeare monologue chosen from the selection provided, confidently performed, from memory, with clear characterisation and simple staging

Option 2 – Musical Theatre pathway

- a musical theatre song of your choice, confidently performed to a backing track, from memory, with clear characterisation and simple staging

Option 3 – Backstage Theatre Arts pathway

- 2 - 2 ½ minutes presentation of either a character / item of furniture / set piece / prop from one of the following productions:
 - Trainspotting the Musical
 - My Neighbour Totoro
 - Hamlet
- and an A3 design board
- Your performance / presentation will be video recorded and uploaded to a YouTube playlist. You will be expected to upload the link to your Edublogs 'Induction Summer Work' page (once the course has started)

Practical Skills

Following your performance / presentation of your summer work in Induction; write an evaluation and reflection which critically examines:

Task 5a your level of preparation

Task 5b your performance OR your presentation & scale model / maquette

Task 5c what you need to improve moving forwards

This evaluation needs to be added to your digital document by the deadline so that it can be checked by an assessor.

Evaluation & Reflection
