Placement Exams for the Major:

Please note that all tests below are timed tests that can only be attempted once. Please take a moment to prepare.

Please make sure your calculator has fresh batteries or is fully charged. During the test, please turn off all distractions.

1. [Math Placement Test](#) - Only if your SAT MAT was less than 550 or your ACT MAT was less than 22. Take this online placement test as soon as possible and prior to registering for classes. If you don't pass the Math Placement Test with a score of 10 or higher, then register for MAT 1001.
2. [Calculus Readiness Test](#) - You must take Calculus (MAT 1110) for this major and therefore need to take this test regardless of your SAT or ACT score.

First-Year Student Course Recommendations:

1. RC 1000 or UCO 1200 if there are seats available. If not, it's fine to take both classes in the spring semester.
2. Enroll in **MAT 1110: Calculus I** if eligible. If not, enroll in MAT 1025: Pre-Calculus or MAT 1001: Foundations and Mindsets, depending on your placement scores. See the Math Guide for more information.
3. Enroll in a General Education Designation or Category course.*
4. Enroll in a General Education Science Inquiry course.
5. Enroll in a General Education **Wellness Literacy** course.

*Look for a **Category** course (Sustainability & Climate Literacy, Intercultural Literacy, or Humanity & Its Systems) that also carries a **Designation**: Historical Studies (HS), Fine Arts (FA), Literary Studies (LS)** or Social Sciences (SS).

**Note: English (ENG) Literary Studies (LS) designation courses have a prerequisite of RC 1000.

GOAL: Register for at least 15 hours of classes. You can adjust your schedule (i.e., add and drop classes) as needed through the end of the drop/add period.

 - All English Literary Studies: ENG xxxx (LS) designation courses have a prerequisite of R C 1000, First Year Writing (R C = Rhetoric & Composition.)
