Code of Conduct

The AWS User Group Munich (AWS UG) meetups are community events to facilitate networking, collaboration and education in the AWS community.

We value the participation of each member of the AWS community and want all attendees to have an enjoyable, fulfilling experience. All attendees are expected to show respect and courtesy to others throughout the event.

Everyone who participates in an AWS UG Munich event must adhere to the following Code of Conduct. Organizers will enforce this code throughout the event.

Our standards

AWS UG Munich is dedicated to providing a positive event experience for everyone, regardless of age, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, ethnicity, nationality, race, or religion (or lack thereof), education, or socioeconomic status.

Examples of behavior that contributes to creating a positive environment include:

- Being kind to others
- Behaving professionally
- Using welcoming and inclusive language
- Being respectful of differing viewpoints and experiences
- Accepting constructive criticism graciously

Examples of unacceptable behavior by participants include:

- Sexual language and imagery in any event venue, including talks
- Violent threats or language directed against another person
- Deliberate intimidation, stalking or following
- Insults or put-downs
- Sexist, racist, homophobic, transphobic, ableist, or exclusionary jokes
- Unwelcome sexual attention or advances
- Unwelcome physical contact
- Sustained disruption of talks or other activities
- Participants asked to stop any inappropriate behavior are expected to comply immediately.

If a participant engages in behavior that violates this Code of Conduct, the meetup organizers will take appropriate action. This may include:

- Verbal warning
- Removal from the event
- Disinvitation from future AWS UG Munich events
