articles from Power Library:

Sign in to <u>Clever</u>, select <u>Power Library-All Resources</u>, scroll to <u>High School</u> (<u>Gale OneFile</u>), and <u>select it</u> (<u>you may want to search other available databases - this is okay!</u>) Enter your search terms/keywords. Your search defaults to magazines, but you can switch your source type to gather new results by selecting different source types at the top.

Select the cite button at the top of the screen (once an article is open) to export the citation to NoodleTools!!

scholarly articles from **Google Scholar**.

Links on the right should take you to full-text articles.

To import a scholarly article in NoodleTools, select Website and then Journal. You will paste the DOI number and the URL into the cells. When the DOI number is imported, it will help you search for the source to import. In rare cases, you must enter the cells manually (when it cannot find your source via the DOI or URL)

scholarly articles from Google

Search for your keyword(s) and add the term scholarly articles for your results

To import a scholarly article in NoodleTools, select Website and then Journal. You will paste the DOI number and the URL into the cells. When the DOI number is imported, it will help you search for the source to import. In rare cases, you must enter the cells manually (when it cannot find your source via the DOI or URL)

articles from **EBSCOhost**

Login through Google

Select EBSCOhost Web

If you select the **All Databases** hyperlink, you can deselect various databases within EBSCOhost. You may like to deselect the eBooks. Good choices to select are **Advanced Placement Source**, since it has scholarly journal articles that are typically blocked with a paywall. **Points of View Reference Source** is a really nice option to select for an argumentative or persuasive topic.

Select the cite button at the top of the screen (once an article is open) to export the citation to NoodleTools!!

print books or eBooks

Find print Books from our library catalog

Select **View More Details** and then go to the **More Info** tab to access the ISBN to import your book title into NoodleTools

Find eBooks from **Power Library**:

Sign in to <u>Clever</u>, select <u>Power Library</u>, select <u>Click Here for All Resources (far right)</u>, scroll to <u>eBook Collection</u>, and <u>select it</u>. Enter your search terms/keywords.

There may be multiple ISBNs. Just select one ISBN set to import your book title into NoodleTools

a quality website or a public opinion poll

If you are searching for a website, make certain your website has at least two of the following:

- an author with credentials you can locate
- a specific copyright date with month, date, and year
- a list of resources they have referred to write the article
- They are (or are associated with) a well-known organization

If you are searching for public opinion, Pew Research Center is a highly regarded source

Citing a website in NoodleTools
