This section is not merely for the research method but also can be modified according to the authors' necessity. For example, Related Works, Preliminaries, etc.

4. Result

In the results section contains the presentation of the results of research can be illustrated using tables or figures to clarify the presentation of the results verbally. The data presented is data that is processed, not raw data.

2. Table Callouts. All tables included in the chapter manuscript must be referenced in the body of the chapter




Figure 1: Caption of figure with color




Figure 2: Caption of figure no color
