#### Reports - 5:36 PM

- I. Michael Hughes | Dean of the Library and Chief Librarian & Anna Hond | Strategic Planner
  - Library Strategic Planning
    - We are creating a strategic plan for the library over the next 3 years. CUNY has a strategic plan, Baruch has one, and we would like to create one for the library to align with them both and accomplish the following goals: students success, research and teaching excellence, building community, and ensuring operational and infrastructural stability.

- We would love to hear how the library can better support students:
  - Abibatou Diarra | USG Representative Senator: Could we extend the library's current operating hours?
    - **Michael:** We will note that to look into it later. We know that the library used to be open 24 hours during finals season.
  - Paz Moran | USG Representative Senator: I think we need a designated "loud" area to promote social interaction and to minimize other areas being loud.
  - Maria Elisabeth Torrealba | USG Representative Senator: We need better communication/ marketing to inform students on what the library offers. There are many valuable resources that often go unnoticed
  - Michael: What outlets would be best to accomplish this?
    - Makkedah Ramsey | USG Executive Vice President: Meeting
      with us at Senate helps, and include library-related information in
      new student events like convocation. Otherwise, go to where
      students are.
    - Marc Fleurantin | USG Representative Senator: Also, collaborate with departments or clubs to get the word to spread. Social media, particularly Instagram, would be one of the most efficient ways to reach students.
    - Christian Perez | USG Chair of Marketing: Also take advantage
      of existing newsletters or email blasts, like those from OSL or
      other clubs.
  - Justina Dodani | USG Chair of Appeals: Baruch technology should also include subscriptions to services that students use like Canva. It could be a section in the library but it would be helpful for students who need these software but can't afford to pay subscriptions for it.
  - Paz: A bulletin board in the library of technology available to borrow would also help students already in there.
  - Joseph Grullon | USG Vice Chair of Academic Affairs: The Bursar's Office on the 8th floor has a banner of what they can help with. The library can do something similar to let students know what they have and don't have at a glance.
  - Muskaan Bisal | USG Representative Senator: The facilities need improvement as well, especially the many charging ports on the tables that don't work.
  - Jason Martinez | USG Executive Secretary: Have a sign telling students that you can't access the upper floors of the library (6,7,8,9) through the intermediate floors (2,3,4,5). Many students new to the library don't know this and it is confusing.
  - **Abibatou:** Partner with FYS so instructors can inform incoming students on what the library offers.
    - Marc: NSP has already started doing this!

- Myat Thwe | USG Representative Senator: The ID center is unnecessarily confusing to find, so a sign for that would be helpful.
- **Miguel Rosario** | **USG Representative Senator:** The library's online resources/ portals also need updating.
- Maria: The Subotnick Center, while it is not technically part of the library, also needs better outreach.
- **Makkedah:** We also recommend you look into USG student liaisons to promote things going on in the library.
- Marc: Calculators, especially financial calculators, are high in demand. Is there a possibility to increase the amount of semester-long calculator loans?
  - **Michael:** That will be a longer term endeavor, every year we ask for more money. With your feedback and voices, we can make a stronger case.
- Sanila Rahman | USG Vice Chair of Campus Affairs: We recommend having pop-ups in the NVC 2nd Floor Lobby to loan supplies so that students have easier access to them when they need it. This could be done during midterms or finals season so that lines don't build up too much in the library and students can get to their exams prepared more easily.

# II. Kannan Mohan | Associate Dean for Academic Affairs and Innovation & Elizabeth Edenburg | Philosophy Department

- AI Committee Report
  - We talked to industry professionals, students, professors, advisory councils and others to arrive at our findings in this report. The report will be out sometime next week through the Provost.
  - There are 2 new AI minors: AI Essentials Minor for all Majors and Quantitative Foundations of AI Minor. Among others, there is also a new Ethics of AI course that will start in the Fall. We are also including prompt engineering and other AI related curriculum in the Zicklin core CIS classes.
  - We hope to work with all 3 schools to see where more AI education can be added.
    - **Abibatou:** For the AI Essentials course, are you considering making this required for all students?
    - Kannan: We will likely not make it a requirement given the rigidity of Zicklin students' requirements. Instead, we are adding some AI coursework in existing CIS courses that Zicklin students would take anyway.
    - **Justina:** Are you considering including Blockchain concepts in coursework?
    - **Kannan:** We have a fintech minor that was released 2 to 3 years ago and covers Blockchain, crypto, analytics, etc..

- Sanila: Have you considered making AI coursework similar to SAM assignments, modular assignments that take up a percentage of a grade in an established course?
  - **Kannan:** That's an excellent idea, we found that the SAM model works well with providing modules and have already recommended something similar in the committee.
  - **Abibatou:** Another recommendation could be educational videos such as those found in a McGraw Hill Connect Orientation module. Every single course taken using Connect starts the course with that orientation on how to use Connect, so integrating AI education with that could be an idea.
  - Elizabeth: We are working on developing that stuff along with recommending the Library and Writing Center develop student-facing workshops to have AI-savvy people educate.
- **Miguel:** AI is advancing at an exponential rate, and I'm concerned that by the time we roll out courses, the content could become outdated in a matter of a couple years.

#### Zicklin Updates

- The aforementioned AI updates are cross college, meaning they affect all 3 schools within Baruch. We met with you all earlier this semester and wanted to update you on our progress and Zicklin-related news.
- o Baruch Business Academy
  - 3 to 4 years ago, we launched the Baruch Business Academy as a partnership with Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) to streamline transfers. We have expanded this program to 6 community colleges (BMCC, LAGCC, QBCC, BXCC, Hostos and Guttman. They are waiting on a response from Kingsborough). We went from having just 25 students in our pilot for this program to now 650 students total across the aforementioned colleges. We monitor what classes students take to ensure they know what classes will directly benefit them in their transfer to Baruch and what won't. We believe the Baruch Business Academy is the future of how students looking to transfer to Zicklin go about it.

#### CPA Update

■ The CPA used to require 150 hours, and it may be reduced to 120 hours pending approval by the New York State Senate. The Accounting Department is preparing to ensure that accounting students can meet any new requirements should this change take place.

#### 4+1 Program Update

- There is a 4+1 or accelerated path from undergraduate to graduate that is on the verge of getting approval by the graduate committee.
- Students that have taken 75+ credits would be eligible to apply to graduate programs, and once they cross 90+ credits and have gone through the graduate admissions process, they'd be able to take graduate-level courses

during their undergraduate years at the undergraduate tuition rate. This will work for up to 12 credits.

- **Muskaan Bisal:** If the graduate committee approves the accelerator program tomorrow, when will it be implemented?
- Kannan: Likely by Spring '26.
- o New BS Degree
  - We will initiate an intent to create notice to CUNY to introduce the first Bachelor's of Science degree in Zicklin: Applied Data Science & AI. A collaboration between the Weissman and Zicklin schools, it is geared to meet market changes in data science and AI and would be the first BS degree offered in Zicklin.

    - \$702 in refreshments for their regular events program
    - \$378 in miscellaneous for their special events program
