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Public speaking (English script)

And in our customs, we know there are some kinds of events that these things usually take place at and we organize and arrange this from time to time. For example, funerals, first year birthday parties, welcoming parties, and other events, as well. And for these things, when it comes to these things, there is someone that they have set aside, someone that has been delegated, to speak to many people. So how come they acknowledge them? Because they can, because it is a person who is fearless, because it is a person who is observant, because it is a person who is knowledgeable in arranging their words from time to time. And so this is the unique way to approach the method for public speaking. The main thing is that there are some methods that you

must follow so that you are the type of person who is well-spoken and eloquent when they are speaking, especially to a large group of people. And if we take a look at the list of ways to speak, we know there are three points on how to speak. The first one is at the beginning or in English they say the “introduction” that takes place at the very beginning. This is where you show your thankfulness, you show your support, you show your respect, and so on and so forth. Now move down to the third step, where they say it’s the body of the speech, and this is where you share what your main point is that you wish to expand upon. For example, if this was for, for a funeral, this is where you would talk about the history or the background of the person, for example, if you are the person to speak on their passing, you will speak on the good qualities of the person that you are all gathering to sit with. This is when you would really pay respects to them, and praise them, and this is when you would share memories, just give you a brief synopsis. And the very last step is the closing statement. This is where you restate or repeat acknowledgments, where you state your support. Right? Always remember when you are speaking in public, it’s not just any random words. All of your talking points must align uniformly from the beginning to the next, next, next and to the very last point. It is no different than writing a paper. When you are writing an important paper, you have to organize it from top to bottom, and it is no different from when you speak. Because when you speak you have to go from the top, down. The first thing is that you express your thankfulness, thank God, recognize those and support them according to our customs, these kinds of things. The body, now, the body of the speech, this is where you come and speak, and this is where you share a little bit about yourself and your friends that came with you, share the important things. So now the ending you will go back and restate or go over everything from the beginning and most importantly, you give your last “thank you” to wrap up your speech. And like I said before, in order for you to be a person who is great and really good

at speaking, you must remember that you have to be someone who is bold and observant and someone whose contemplations are full of good things. Always speaking correctly, at all times. When you speak, you should not move back and forth, you shouldn't go and...but you should straighten up, stand up. And in our customs, there are also steps to follow in this regard. There are ways to stand if the person was just a normal person, you stand in front of them, and you can stand however you want to stand. But remember there are customs we follow for standing up and there are some that you should not be sloppy when standing in front of them. Ok? There are some procedures that you must follow, for example, when you are standing in front of those who are dignitaries in our culture, especially, government officials, you put your hands behind your back, clasp them, and after that, straighten yourself up, and start speaking. And so that you will be a good speaker, you need to be someone who reflects well. Well, I believe this information that I shared in this little video will help you, and broaden your thinking, and that they will lift you up from depths below, so that you will be a person who is an intelligent and sharp-witted speaker.
