

CADA/CASL Leadership Camps Early Arrival Information

The Early Arrival option is for schools traveling a long distance wishing to arrive the day before camp starts. There is an additional cost per person for the extra night of lodging and Early Arrival reservations must be made by <u>May 17</u>.


Arrival at UCSB

Check-in to the Santa Rosa Residence Hall as early as 2:00 p.m. on your day of arrival.

Where do I go when I get to the University?

Next, walk to the main desk at **Santa Rosa Hall** and check-in there with UCSB conference service staff who will provide you with your residence hall room assignments. Early Arrival schools stay in San Nicolaas Hall.




Camp Check-in

You are on your own until **11:00 a.m.** on day 1 of camp. Camp Check-in begins on the San Miguel/San Nicolas lawn. Look for the CADA/CASL canopies and inflatables. The school advisor should head to Station 1 near the entrance to San Miguel Hall after 11:00 to start the check-in process. A catered lunch will be available beginning at 12:00 p.m.

General Information

Isla Vista is within walking distance. There are a lot of great spots to eat, including the original Freebirds, Woodstock's Pizza, Habit Burger, Super Cuca's, Sam's To Go, and Starbucks.



Residence Halls/Safety Guidelines

Always travel in pairs or in groups, whether you are venturing into Isla Vista or exploring the UCSB campus. The residence hall desk attendants in Santa Rosa are quite helpful in getting you around town and offering suggestions.

We know that you are on your own until 11:00 am when we start Camp Check-in, but we do ask that you follow a few rules to make your stay more enjoyable (as well as the stay of other summer groups staying in residence halls surrounding CADA).

- Because of safety and personal concerns, ALL camp participants (students and advisors)
 are allowed ONLY in their own assigned sleeping rooms. If you wish to meet with other
 students or advisors please meet in a common area. HALLWAYS are NOT common areas.
- 2. We ask that you have a lights out policy around 11:00 pm. Of course, if your students are with you off campus you are fine, however when in common residence hall areas we need to be respectful of others who have traveled far and are wishing to sleep. We also share the facilities with other student groups. **Quiet hours at UCSB begin at 10:00 pm.**

- 3. The use or possession of alcohol, drugs or tobacco is absolutely prohibited. Violators will be sent home immediately. (Even if it's an early arrival.)
- 4. We are guests of the university. Their rules must be followed at all times.
- 5. Close curtains and drapes at night (you may not be able to see out, yet others can see in).

Please note that CADA Camp staff are generally not available on site the day before camp begins.
