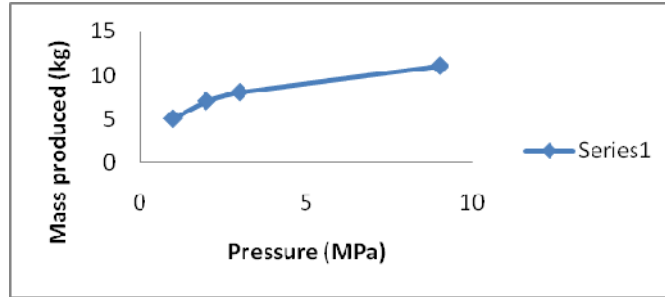


FIGURE 1. You should put a caption in Times New Roman (9 pt font size)

3.2 Equations

All the equations should be numbered and centered. An example is shown below:
